

HUMAN SERVICES PLANNING PROGRAMS

- 28 member Continuum of Care
- 248 attendees at the Homeless and Housing Task Force
- 407 attendees at HSC Workshops
- Nonprofit Consulting Services
- 161 attendees at the HSC Forums
- **Agency Funding Review and Program Support**
- FEMA
- 3,000 person listserv



HEALTH PLANNING COUNCIL PROGRAMS

- 800 individuals assisted by Health Insurance Navigators
- 649 cases completed by the Community Health Advocates
- 1,200 prescriptions through Urgent Rx
- Mental Health and Medical Transportation initiatives through the Population Health Improvement Program



2-1-1/I&R PROGRAMS

- 14,000 calls, texts and walk-ins through 24/7 Information and Referral
- 3,900 VITA Income Tax Program calls screened and scheduled
- 930 medical ride requests came through FISH
- 1,080 health insurance appointment screening and scheduling

- Submit the yearly HUD grant proposal
- Oversee the Coordinated Assessment
- Report on Homeless Statistics to HUD
- Lead Coordinated Planning Efforts



MAJOR INFLUENCES

- Homelessness increasing due to opioid crisis, other factors
- Finding housing for no, or very low, income individuals continues to be a challenge
- HUD rules and requirements change every year and we must be able to respond to stay competitive for funding
- Increasing number of state and federal funded projects require CoC involvement
- Coordinated Assessment
- Homeless Management Information System
