In accordance with the Election Law, there will be held in the County of Tompkins on November 4, 2014, from 6:00 AM to 9:00 PM, a General Election. The following is a true statement of the offices for which candidates are to be elected at said Election:

Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of New York (4 year term)
Comptroller, State of New York (4 year term)
Attorney General, State of New York (4 year term)
State Supreme Court Justice, 6th Judicial District (14 year term)
Representative in Congress – 23rd Congressional District (2 year term)
State Senator – 51st Senatorial District (2 year term)
 (Towns of Caroline, Danby, Dryden and Groton)
State Senator – 58th Senatorial District (2 year term)
 (City of Ithaca, Towns of Enfield, Ithaca, Newfield and Ulysses)
State Senator – 54th Senatorial District (2 year term)
 (Town of Lansing)
Member of Assembly – 125th District (2 year term)
Tompkins County Clerk (4 year term)
Tompkins County Sheriff (4 year term)
Town Justice – Towns of Dryden, Groton, Lansing and two positions in the Town
 of Newfield (4 year term)
Town Councilman (1 year to fill term) – Towns of Caroline and Danby
City Court Judge, City of Ithaca (10 year term)

The following is a true statement of the proposals which will appear on the ballot:

State of New York Proposal Number One, an amendment to sections 4 and 5 and an addition of new section 5-b to the State Constitution which will revise the redistricting procedure for state legislative and congressional districts.

State of New York Proposal Number Two, an amendment to Section 14 of Article 3 of the State Constitution which would allow the electronic distribution of a state legislature bill to satisfy the constitutional requirement that a bill be printed and on the desks of state legislators at least three days before the legislature votes on it

State of New York Proposal Number Three, a proposition which would authorize the sale of state bonds of up to two billion dollars (\$2,000,000,000) to provide access to classroom technology and high-speed internet connectivity and other improvements to our schools.

In the City of Ithaca

Proposal Number Four, City Proposition Number One

Shall a local law be approved, that would amend the Ithaca City Charter, in order to eliminate the vacant position of Director of Information Technology from the previously-consolidated Department of Public Information and Technology, which is overseen by the City Clerk?
