

2013 Profile of Town of Enfield

1. General Population, Demographics, Housing

- Total Population: 3,512 (2010)
- Median age: 41.2 years (Tompkins County median age: 29.8 years)
- Population increased 4.2% from 2000
- 96.5% of Enfield's population is white. (Tompkins County rate is 82.6%)

Enfield is the third smallest of Tompkins County towns. Its overall population increased by 143 people from 2000 to 2010.



2. Youth Population

The Town of Enfield's youth population shrank between 2000 and 2010. Age groups 0-4, 15-17 and 18-20 increased slightly but age groups 5-9 and 10-14 showed significant decreases. Enfield's youth population, ages 0-17, (to factor out the county's college age youth) is the third smallest in the county.

Approximately 4.9% of Tompkins County youth, ages 0-17, live in Enfield.

4. Health and Substance Use

Youth Substance use

- ICSD student alcohol use is the highest in the county and higher than national rates for 10th and 12th grades. 21% of students in grades 6-12 reported use in the past 30 days.
- ICSD student marijuana use rates are the highest in the county and 10th and 12th grade rates are higher than national peers. 17% of students in grades 6-12 reported use in the past 30 days.
- ICSD youth 30-day cigarette use rates are the second lowest in the county. 5% of students in grades 6-12 reported use in the past 30 days.
- ICSD youth smokeless tobacco rates are the third lowest in the county (4%).

*A Person in Need of Supervision (PINS) is a youth under the age of eighteen who is showing a pattern of habitual disobedience, running away, curfew violations, substance abuse, violent behavior, or school truancy problems. Pre-PINS Diversion Services attempt to resolve the conflicts that brought a youth to the attention of the Probation Department by offering supervision, guidance, and referrals to community resources, thus preventing the need for formal Family Court intervention. Pre-PINS Diversion is a mandatory prerequisite prior to filing a formal PINS petition in Family Court.
