When the Youth Services Department began in 1977, the organization was charged with shaping the future of Tompkins County through providing community resources, assisting youth serving agencies and municipalities, showcasing best practices and research, advocating for young people, and providing comprehensive coordinating services. In 2017, we celebrated how this behind-the-scenes department continues to put young people first and provide backbone support for youth in all communities within Tompkins. The Youth Services Team consists of caring adults who remain committed to ensuring that our vision for a desirable future becomes a reality for all youth within Tompkins County. We are proud to present our 2017 Report to the Community.

EMPOWERMENT

Helping others to achieve their own success

Staff supported seven Community Councils/Youth Commissions, that consist of over 50 volunteers, with a variety of projects including conducting needs assessments, writing annual reports, and holding fundraising events. These efforts help to support at-risk youth through out Tompkins County.

A new five-year agreement was negotiated with eleven municipalities to allow youth throughout the County to participate in recreational programs to meet new friends, learn new skills, and have positive new experiences.

A summary of highlights was produced and distributed of the student survey to educate community members about drug, alcohol, and mental health issues of teens in Tompkins County.

Eleven trainings were provided on a variety of topics to help direct service staff achieve success in the field.



Seeing the bigger picture and planning for the future

Three agencies provide a summer youth employment program offering skills development, job training and first-time job experience to youth 14 to 21. In a contract between TCYSD and Workforce Development Board, we monitor these agencies and provide feedback, with the success of the young people being the prime focus, for the betterment of these programs.

Our Department has dedicated a portion of its efforts supporting youth employment. In 2017 a report was done on "disengaged youth" with the recognition that not all youth engage in the workforce in ways that lead to successful outcomes or may not engage in the work force whatsoever. This report continues to inform our work for how we engage partnering agencies in the advancement of youth employment in TC. We are devoted to collaborating, implementing, improving, and innovating around youth employment.

To celebrate our 40th Anniversary during 2017, TCYSD created the Caring Adult Campaign. The department put out a call for nominations of caring adults who have positively impacted young people and provided their own behind-the-scenes support to youth.

40 Caring Adults were randomly selected from over 100 nominations received. Those chosen were formally honored at the TCYSD 40th Anniversary Celebration on October 18th.

Commitment to honest and fair communications




