## Population and Demographics

Groton Population, All Ages - 5,913, including Village of Groton, whose population is 2,209 Groton is the fifth largest of Tompkins County towns. Population decreased $0.6 \%$ since 2010.

Median Age - 44.1 (Tompkins median age - 31.1)

## Groton Youth Population

Groton's 0-17 youth population declined 19.1\% since 2010. 7.8\% of Tompkins youth ages 0-17 reside in Groton.

Groton's 0-20 youth population declined 32\% since 2010. $4.3 \%$ of Tompkins youth ages 0-20 reside in Groton.
$22.5 \%$ of Groton's population is under age 21.

This table tracks progress by student cohort. The cohort groups all the first-time 9th graders who start school during the same school year and tracks the cohort's progress toward high school completion after 4 and 5 years. "Graduated" includes students with a Regents Diploma, Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation, or Local Diploma. Local Diplomas were phased out for general ed. students in 2013. An IEP diploma is not considered a graduation diploma.

*A Person in Need of Supervision (PINS) is a youth under the age of eighteen who is showing a pattern of habitual disobedience, running away, curfew violations, substance abuse, violent behavior, or school truancy problems. Pre-PINS Diversion Services attempt to resolve the conflicts that brought a youth to the attention of the Probation Department by offering supervision, guidance, and referrals to community resources, thus preventing the need for formal Family Court intervention. Pre-PINS Diversion is a mandatory prerequisite prior to filing a formal PINS petition in Family Court.
