## Population and Demographics

Lansing Population, All Ages - 11,385 (including V. Lansing, whose population is 3,554) Lansing is the fourth largest of Tompkins County towns.
Population decreased $3.2 \%$ since 2010.
Median Age - 40.5 (Tompkins median age - 31.1)


## Lansing Youth Population (including Village)

Lansing's 0-17 youth population increased 8\% since 2010. $14.1 \%$ of Tompkins youth ages 0-17 reside in Lansing.

Lansing's 0-20 youth population increased $2 \%$ since 2010. $7.6 \%$ of Tompkins youth ages 0-20 reside in Lansing.
$23 \%$ of Lansing's population is under age 21.

This table tracks progress by student cohort. The cohort groups all the first-time 9th graders who start school during the same school year and tracks the cohort's progress toward high school completion after 4 and 5 years. "Graduated" includes students with a Regents Diploma, Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation, or Local Diploma. Local Diplomas were phased out for general ed. students in 2013. An IEP diploma is not considered a graduation diploma.

*A Person in Need of Supervision (PINS) is a youth under the age of eighteen who is showing a pattern of habitual disobedience, running away, curfew violations, substance abuse, violent behavior, or school truancy problems. Pre-PINS Diversion Services attempt to resolve the conflicts that brought a youth to the attention of the Probation Department by offering supervision, guidance, and referrals to community resources, thus preventing the need for formal Family Court intervention. Pre-PINS Diversion is a mandatory prerequisite prior to filing a formal PINS petition in Family Court.
