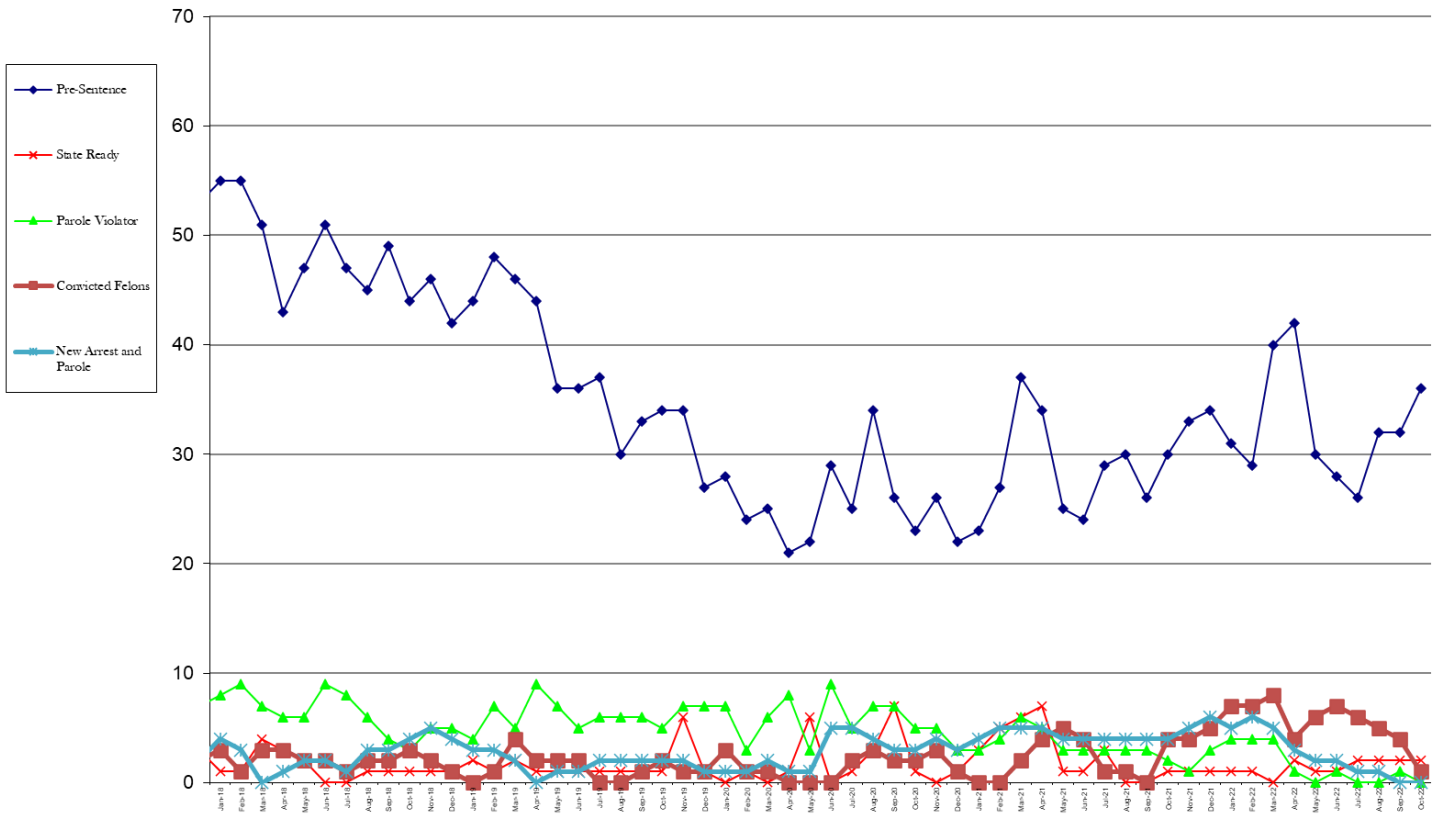

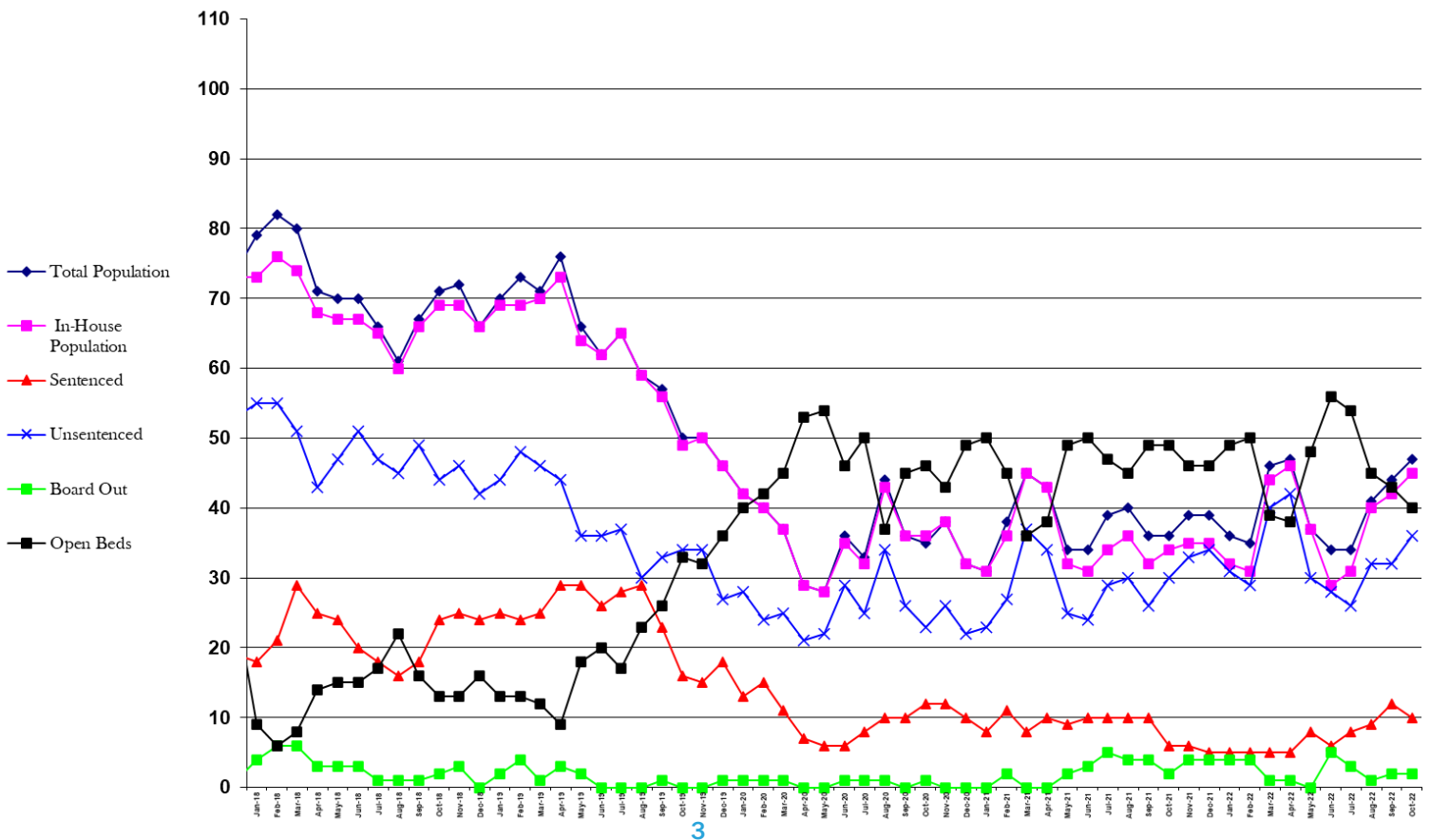

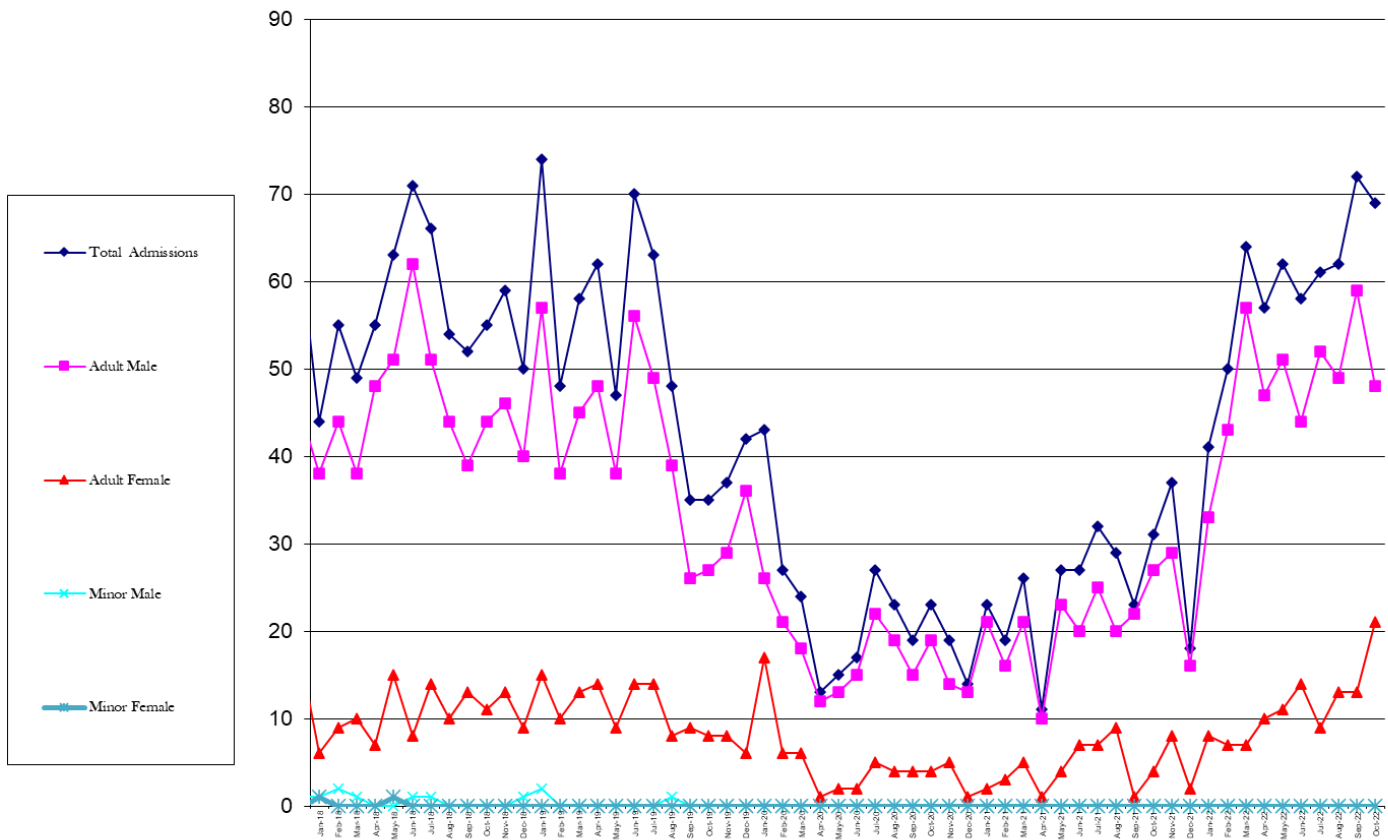

Public Safety Meeting Report October 2022 – Additional Activity



The Tompkins County Sheriff's Office, in conjunction with the Tompkins County Mental Health Department, was able to secure grant funding through OASIS to assist with Medically Assisted Treatment efforts in our correctional facility. We have been providing MAT services for several years now so we were ahead of the game and were able to get creative with the grant funding. We worked closely with REACH medical and developed two initiatives.

The first being, the implementation of tele-med services offered through REACH medical. The thought behind this was to give people the opportunity to virtually meet the medical providers at REACH and become familiar with the services they offer prior to release in an effort to increase their likelihood of a successful transition.

This leads into the second initiative, healthy transition packets. As a group we identified items that would immediately assist someone recently released from jail have a better chance of transitioning back into the community. Each person released from our facility, starting October 7th, will receive a healthy transition bag, which includes the following items (picture is also attached):
