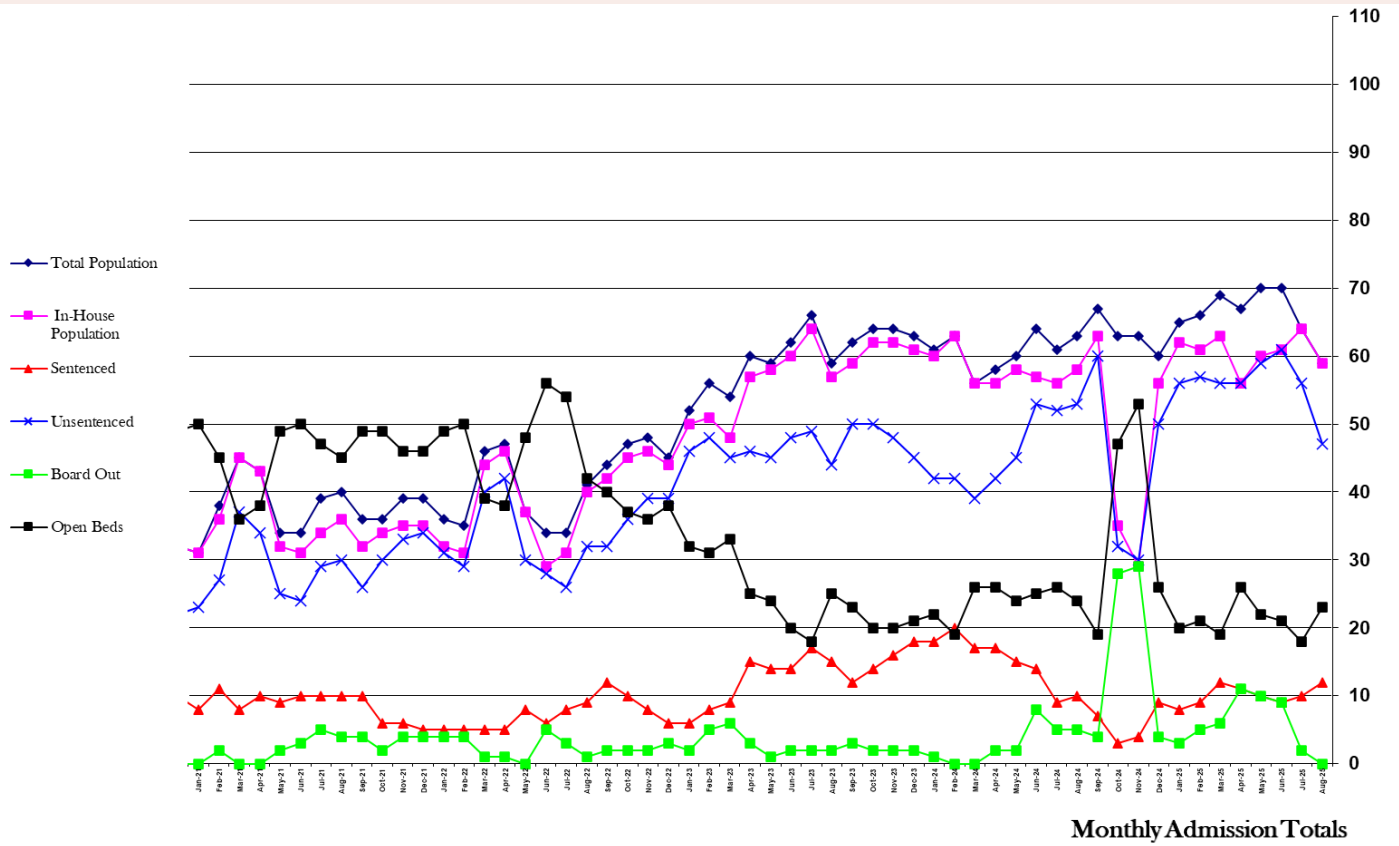

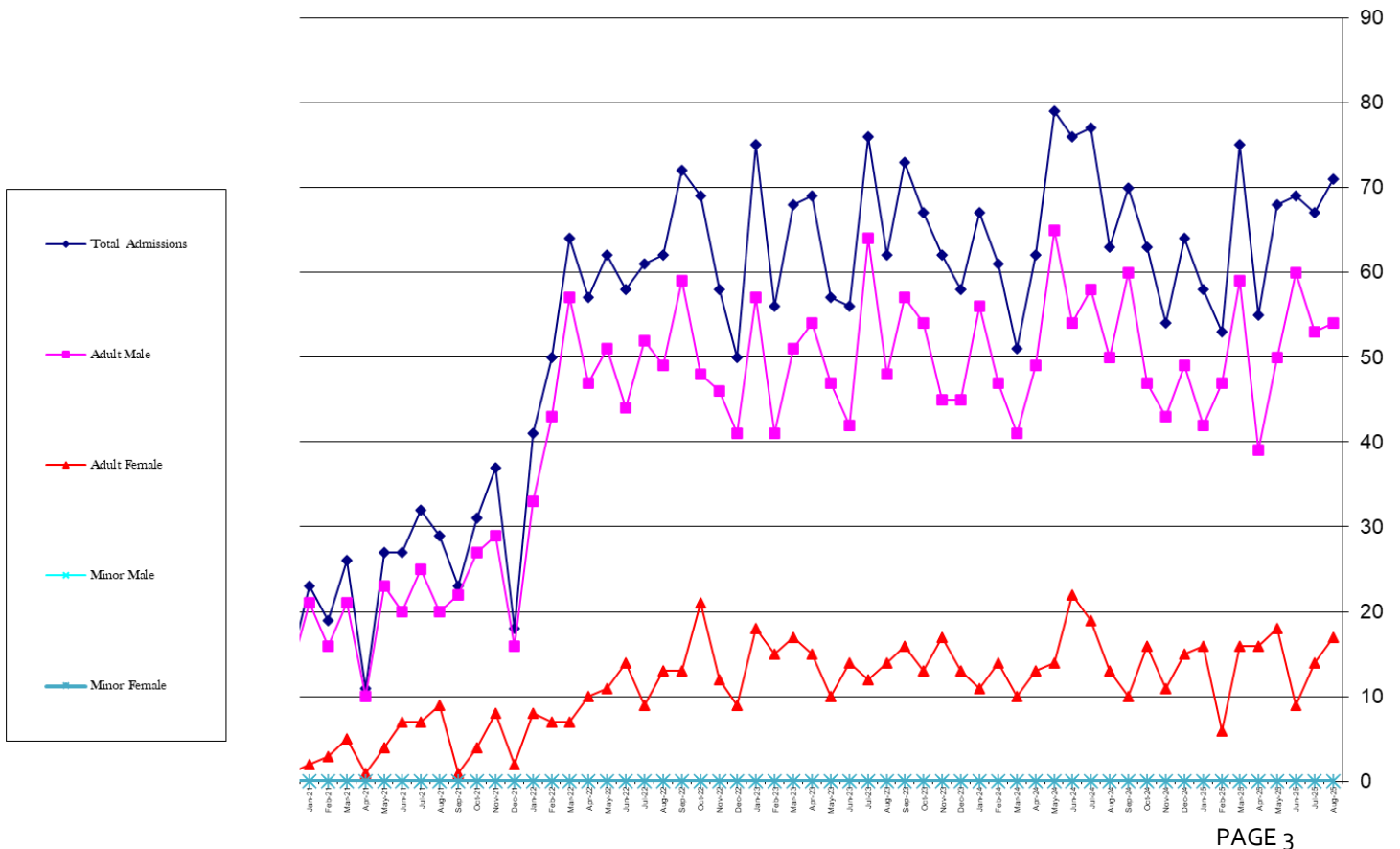

Average Jail Statistics

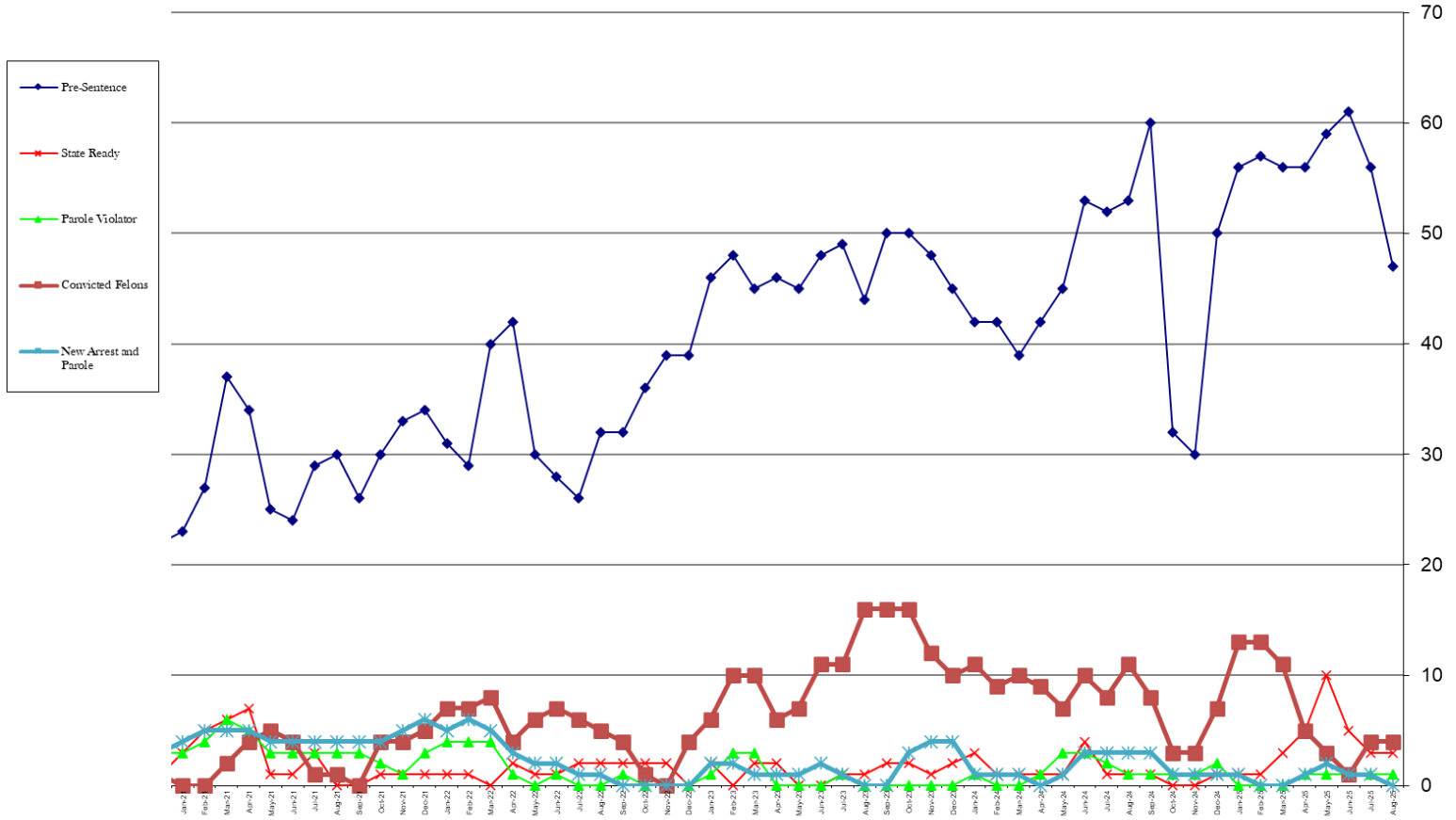


Monthly Admission Totals
