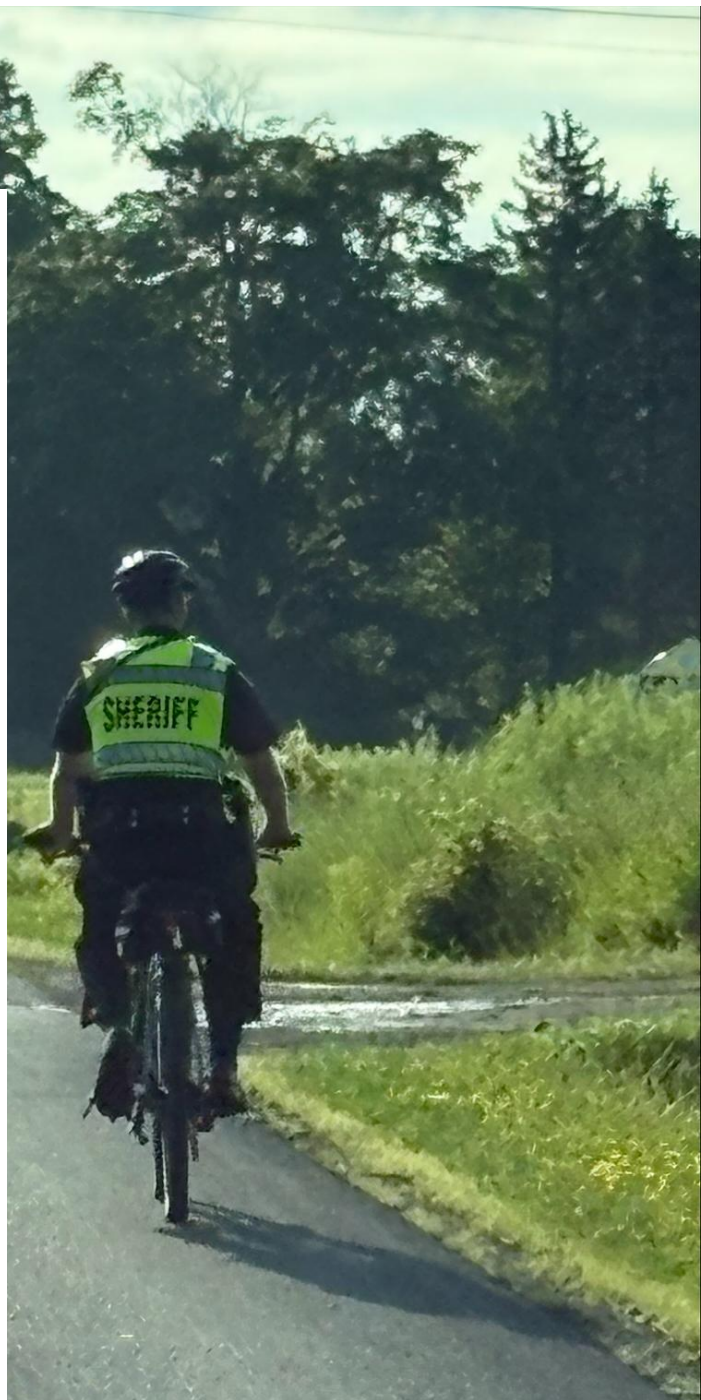

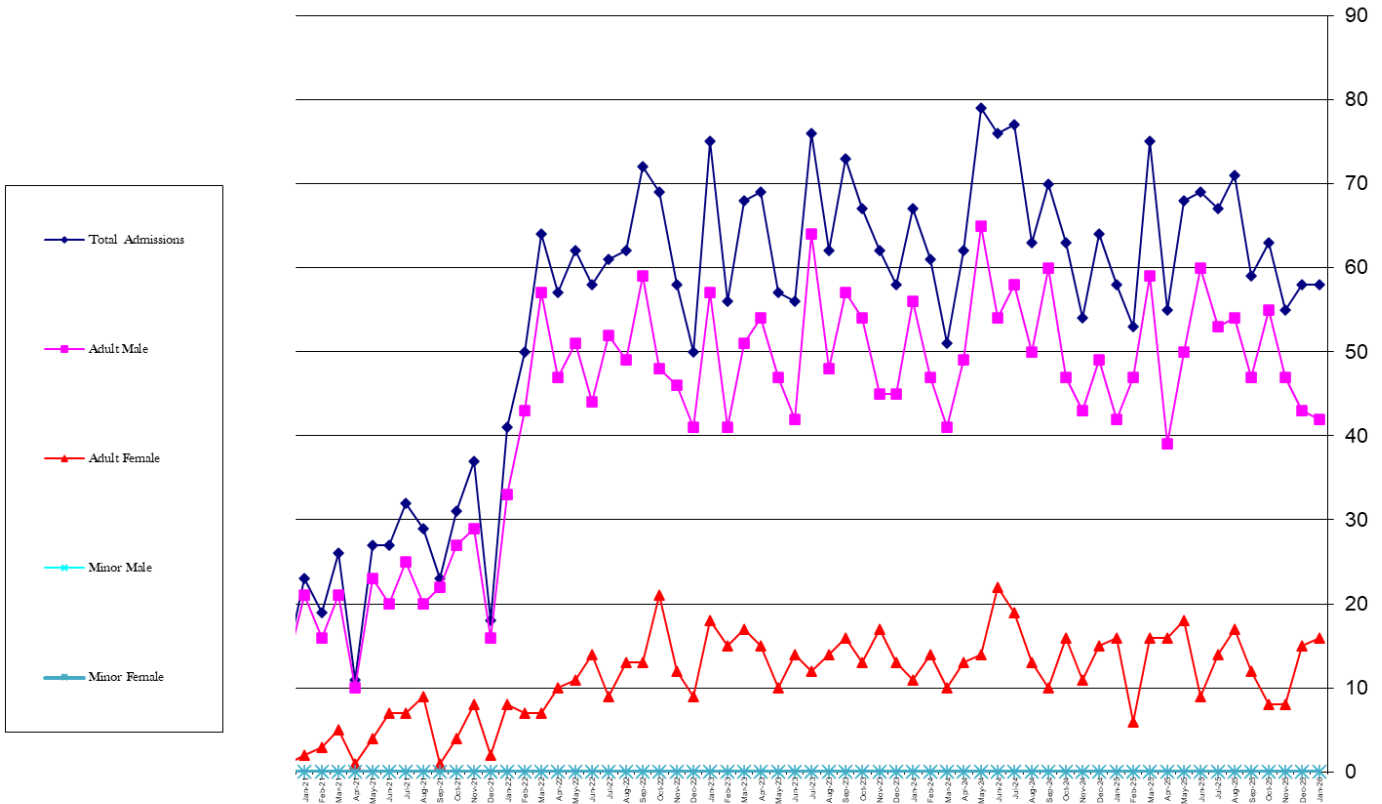

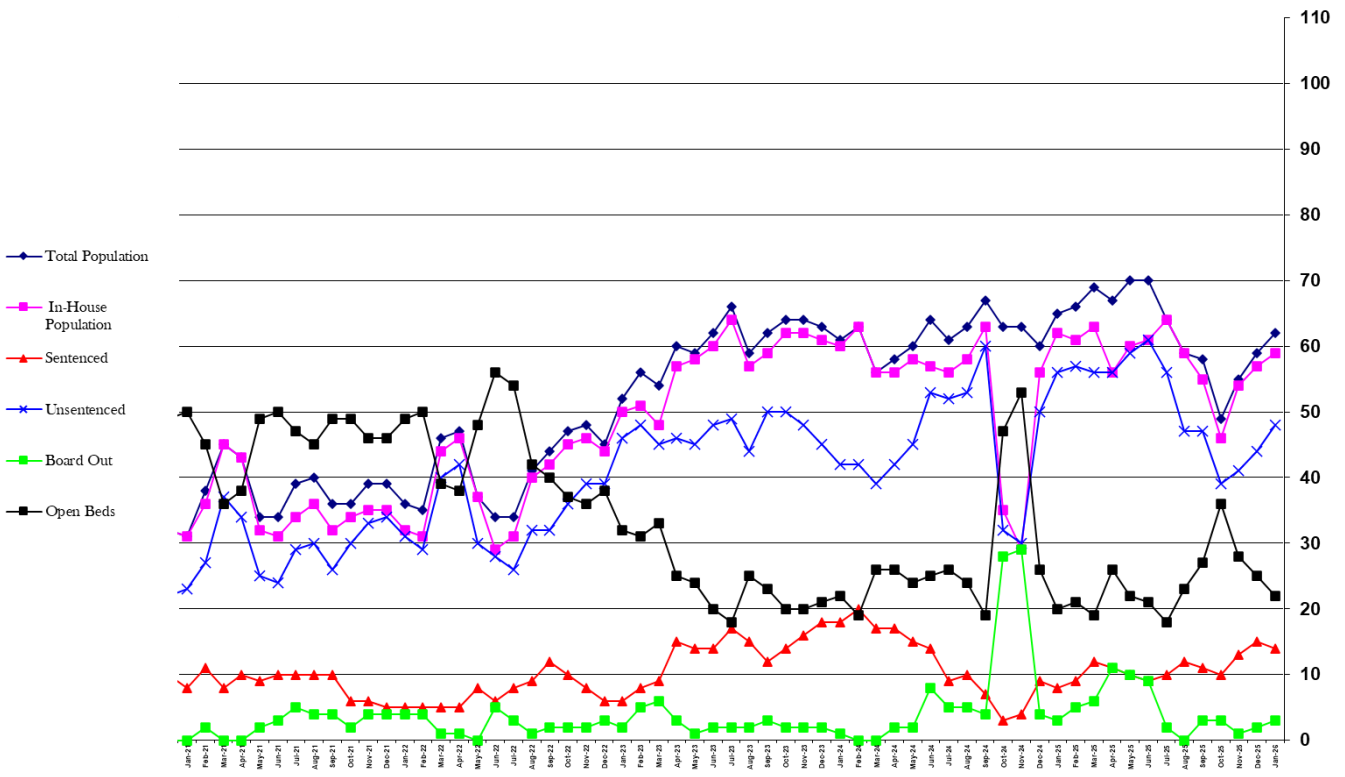

Monthly Admission Totals

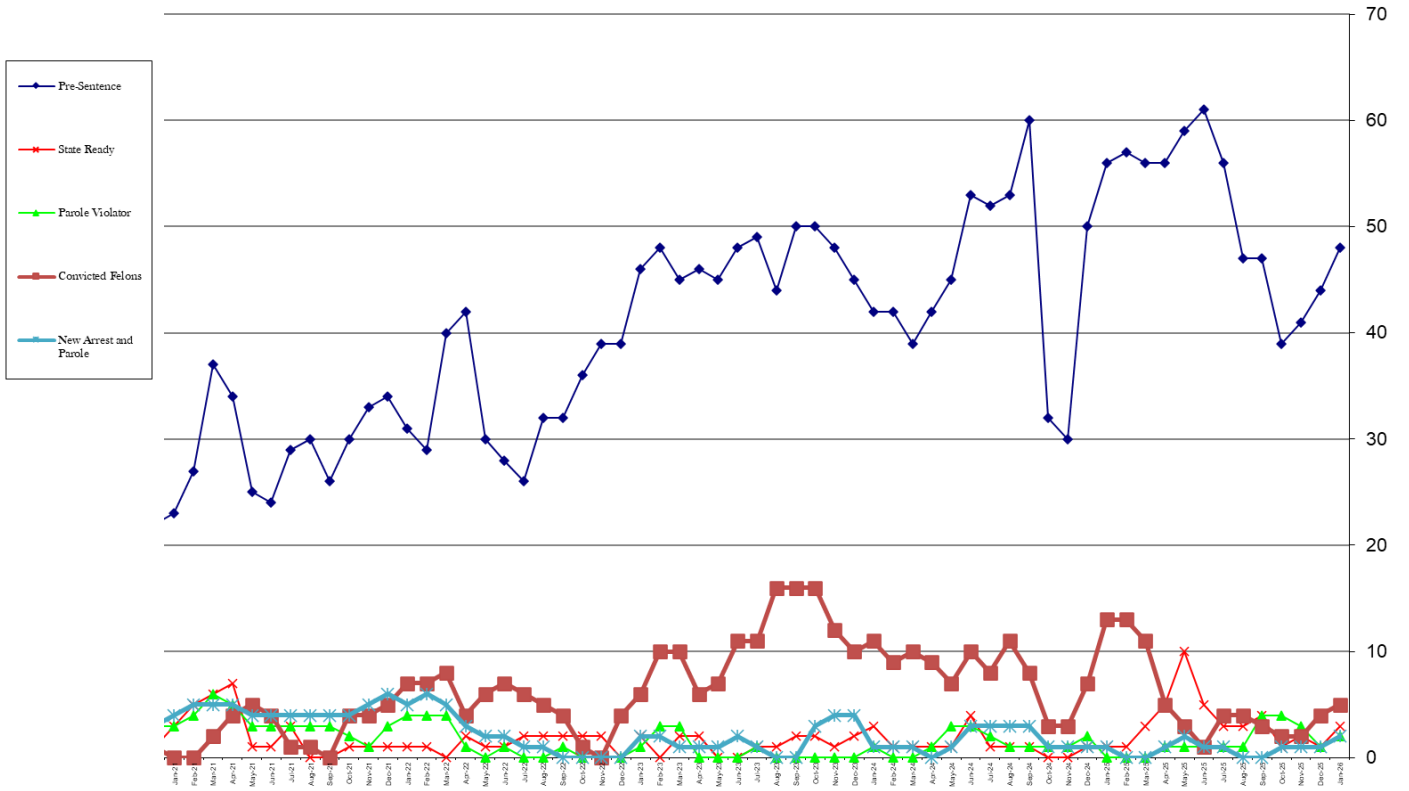


Average Jail Statistics

Activities Continued

- January 30th: Investigator Jami Pier officially retired after over 23 years of dedicated service to the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office. She began her journey with TCSO on September 23, 2002, after successfully completing her training at the Southern Tier Law Enforcement Academy, where she earned the prestigious Academic Achievement Award as the Top Academic Cadet in her session.

Throughout her tenure, Investigator Pier has worn many hats, demonstrating her versatility and commitment to public safety. She first served as a Deputy Sheriff, which included time with our Marine Patrol. Later, she dedicated more than nine years as a Civil Deputy in the Civil Office.

Her leadership extended beyond her duties, as she served as a Trustee for the Tompkins County Deputy Sheriffs' Association.

In recognition of her exceptional work ethic and her ability to build positive relationships within our community, she was promoted to Investigator in February of 2021.

Her service did not go unnoticed, as she was recognized by Kiwanis as Officer of the Month on two separate occasions, once in 2015 and again in 2026.

Investigator Pier's contributions have been extraordinary, earning her accolades such as the Distinguished Service Medal in February 2025, and she made history as the first recipient of the Advocacy Center's Louise Mill Award later that year for her unwavering commitment to victims of sexual assault.

Investigator Pier has exemplified the values of service, integrity, and compassion throughout her career. Her legacy will continue to inspire those who follow in her footsteps, and her impact on our community and our agency will be felt for years to come.
