WHY INDICATORS?

HOW TO USE?



RELEVANT

Departments should choose 1-2 equity indicators aligned with either the strategic plan or an internally identified need that reflects their scope of work.



ASSESS IMPACT

Use the indicators to evaluate the impact of policies, practices, and services on underserved populations.



TRACK & REPORT

Integrate these indicators into your workplan and regularly report progress.

MAKE ADJUSTMENTS

Use the data from these indicators to make necessary changes to better serve.
