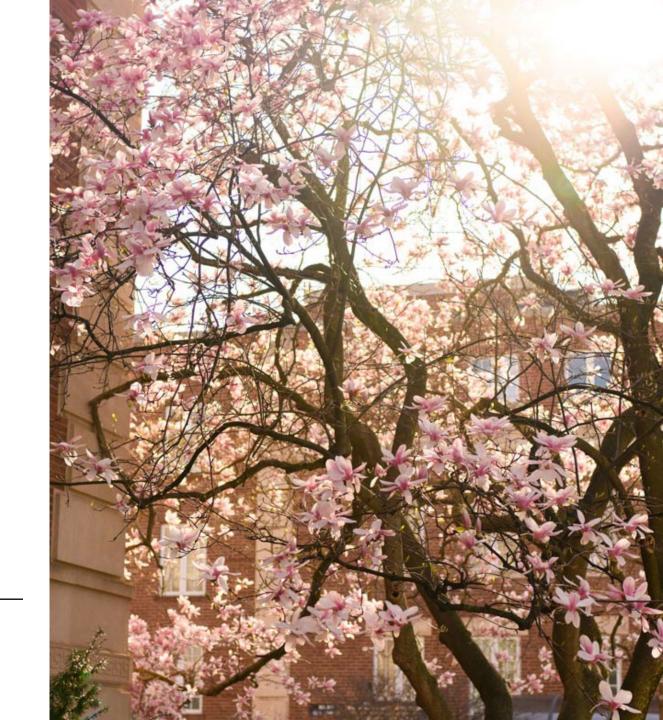

### The Bottom Line

#### Recommended Operating Budget

- Total: **\$245,218,628**
- Recommended Levy total: \$53,443,263
- Levy increase from 2023: 2%
- Property Tax Cap for 2024: 3.54%
- Impact for the owner of a median-priced home: \$53

- Price of Median Home: \$249,000
- Increase in solid waste fee: \$5

• Total: **\$140,975,215** 



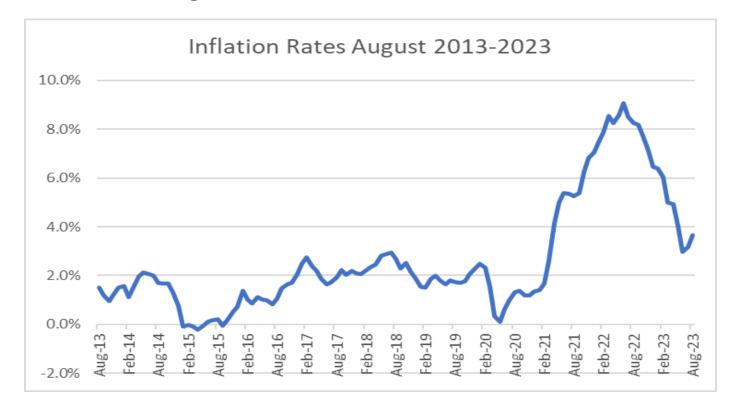

August 2022 to 2023 inflation was 3.7%



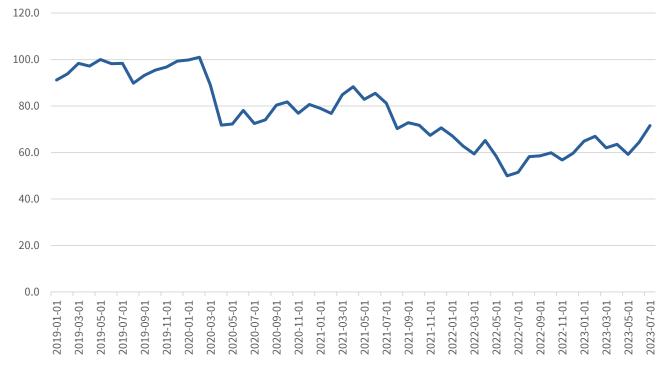

Jan 2019-Jul 2023

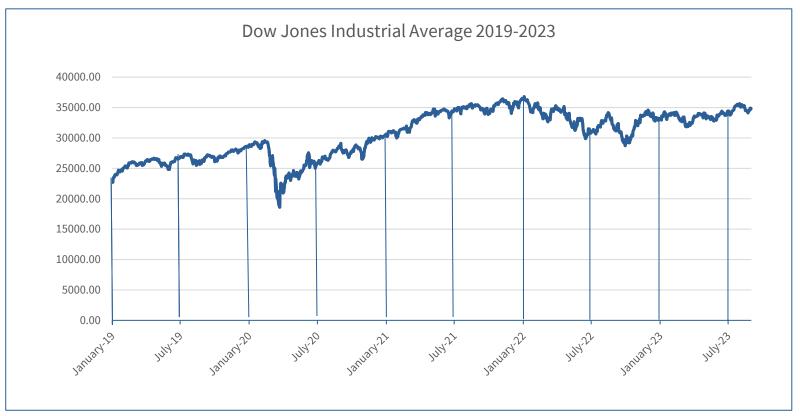
U.S. Consumer Confidence regaining after June 2022 low

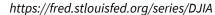


University of Michigan: Consumer Sentiment

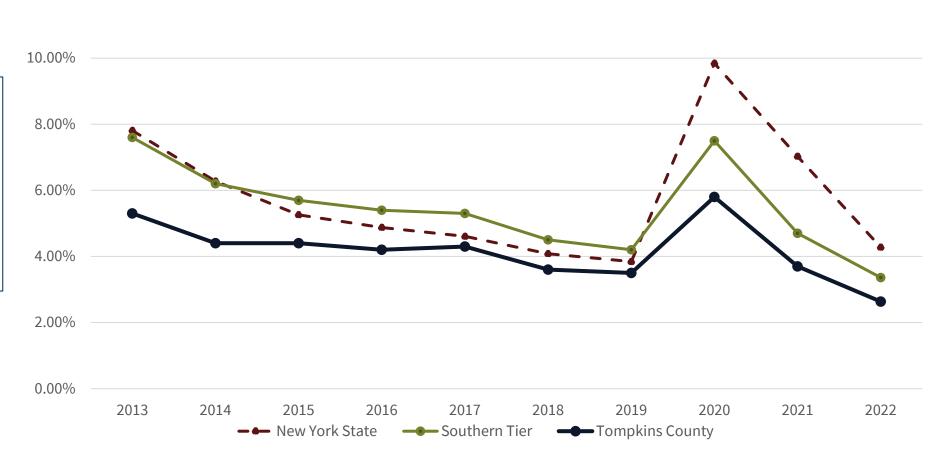




### Average Annual Unemployment Rates 2013 -2022



New York State – 4.3% Southern Tier – 3.4% Tompkins County – 2.6% 12.00%



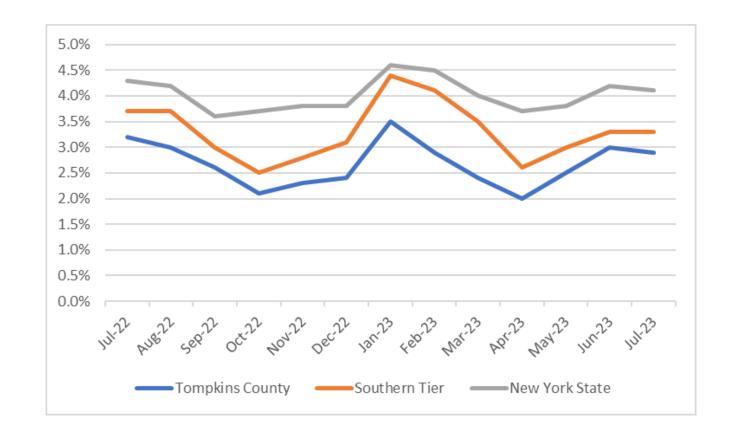

New York State – 4.1% Southern Tier – 3.3% Tompkins County – 2.9%

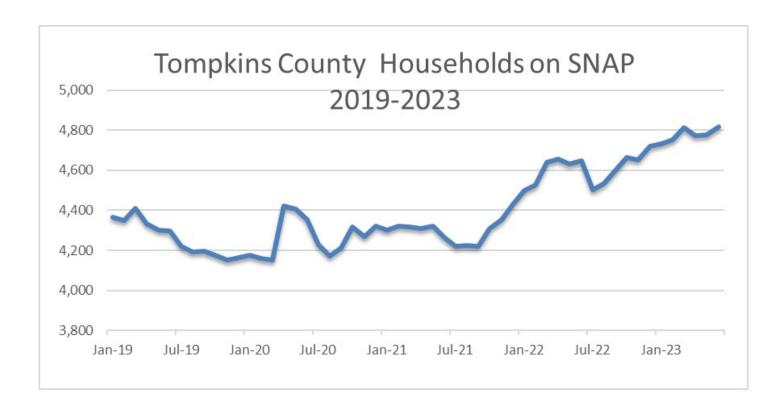




Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

#### Caseloads increasing

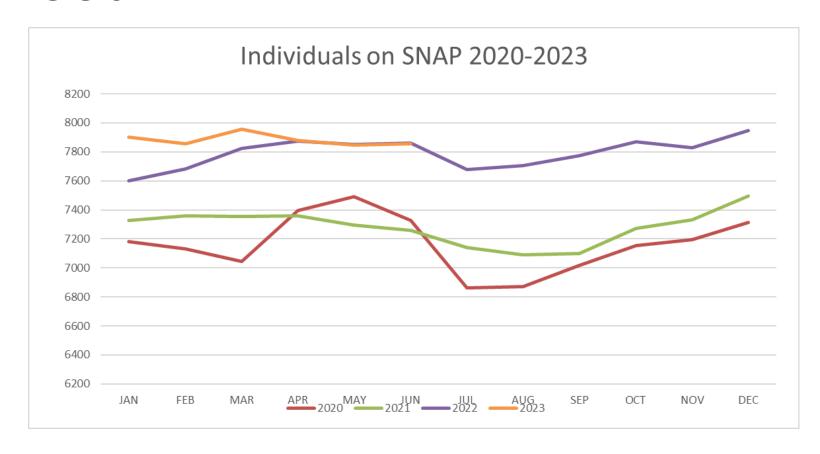
- Up 15% since 2020

- Leveling off in spring of 2023





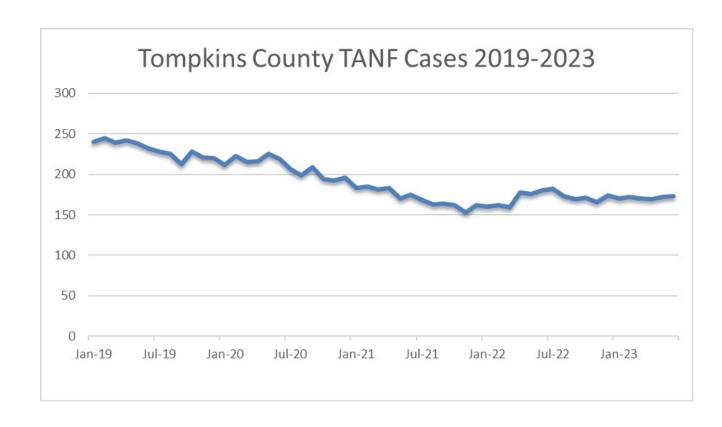
Temporary Assistance (TANF) cases have declined overall

### Mandate Increases

- EFMAP Enhanced Federal Medicaid Assistance Percentage
  - NYS intercepting Federal reimbursement to Counties

- 2024 increase in County cost: \$1.6M
- Safety Net
  - 2024 increase in County cost: \$1.1M
- Assigned Counsel 18b funding
  - Rate increase from \$75 to \$158/ hour
  - NYS reimbursing 50% of increase
  - 2024 increase in County cost: \$367,086



### **Labor Costs**

#### **Status of Contracts:**

- Road Patrol agreement in place for 2024
- Blue Collar and White Collar contracts expire in 2023
- Negotiations continue with Blue Collar; White Collar to follow
- In mediation with Corrections
- Compensation analysis adjustments
- 2024 budget includes \$5.3M increase in salary & fringe costs

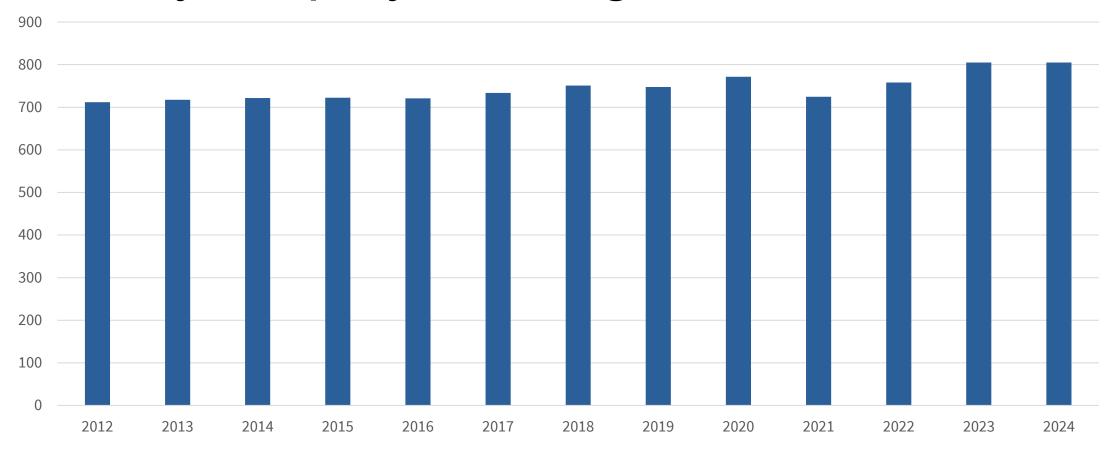


# County Administrator Directed Position Reductions for 2% Target

- County Administration: Budget Director
- Facilities: Project Manager II
- Highway: Senior Highway Crew Supervisor; Seasonal Worker
- Human Rights: Education and Outreach Coordinator (part-time)
- Information Technology Services: Systems Administrator
- Probation: Probation Officer
- Veterans: Veterans Services Officer
- Workforce Development: Communications Specialist
- Youth Services: Youth Services Specialist



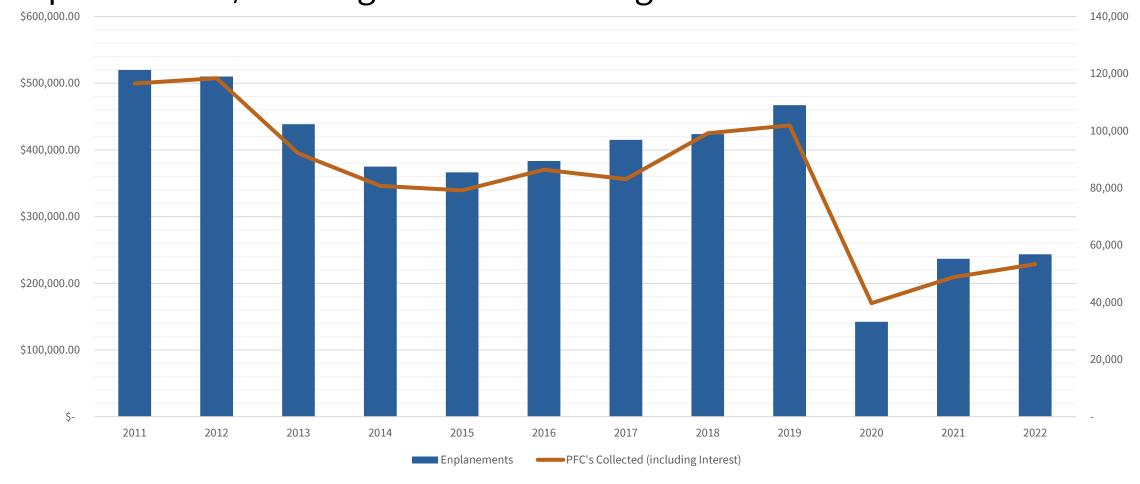
# County Employee Budget FTE

# ITH Airport

- The 2024 budget includes the second year of assistance with operating expenses to aid in Airport recovery:
  - \$1.3M in 2023
  - \$800,000 in 2024
  - \$300,000 in 2025
- The 2024 budget also includes \$681,959 to pay the debt service on the terminal project; expected at least through the next 2-4 years
- Customs Facility fully funded in 2024. Recommendation to consider alternate funding options over the next year or suspend.



# Capital Program

#### Included in 2024:

- Airport- various projects
- Board of Elections- voting machines
- Center of Government
- Department of Emergency Response renewal and replacement
- Facilities- restoration
- Green Fleet

- Highway
   — road maintenance, bridges, machinery
- Information Technology Servicesinfrastructure and maintenance
- Planning- Aquifer study and natural infrastructure; broadband expansion
- Public Safety building renovations- schematic design in 2025
- Recycling & Materials Managementinfrastructure upgrades



# Capital Program

#### Not Included in 2024

- Airport ARFF/SRE building- deferred indefinitely
- CDL testing site
- Green Facilities Phases 2 & 3



# Capital Reductions to meet 2% target goal:

- Planning- Natural Infrastructure (\$200,000)
- Green Fleet- (\$100,000)
- Highway BridgeNY Culvert Replacement- (\$200,000)

- Highway Machinery- (\$300,000)
- ITS- Computer Replacement- (\$100,000)

### Sales Tax

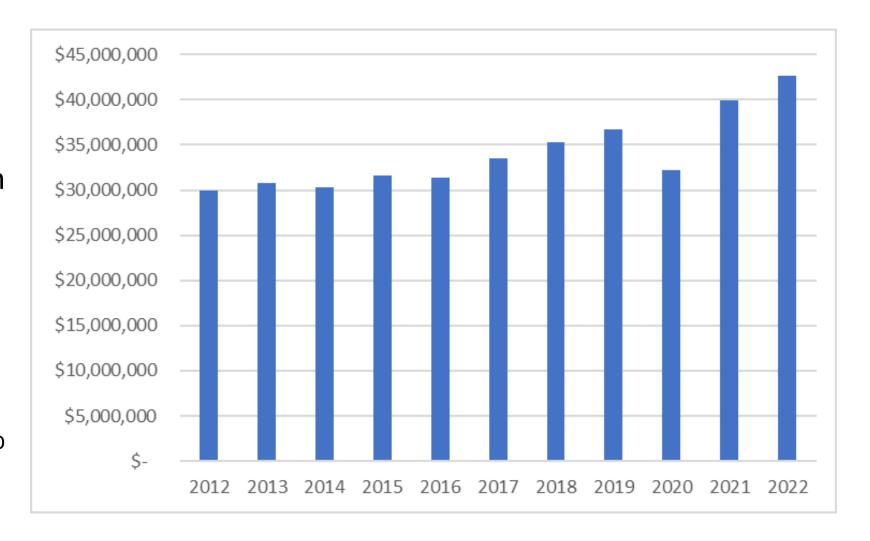
 Average annual sales tax growth of 3.9% from 2012-2022

• Excluding outliers, 3.5% annual growth

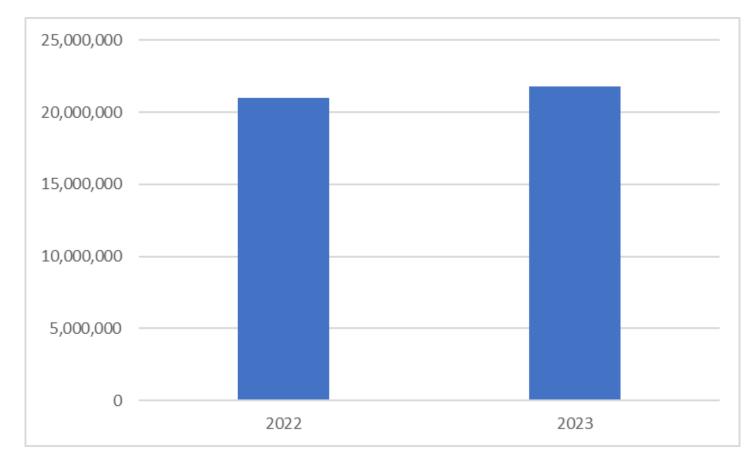




# Sales Tax 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Receipts 2022 & 2023

• 2024 Sales Tax Revenue estimate: \$43.45 million

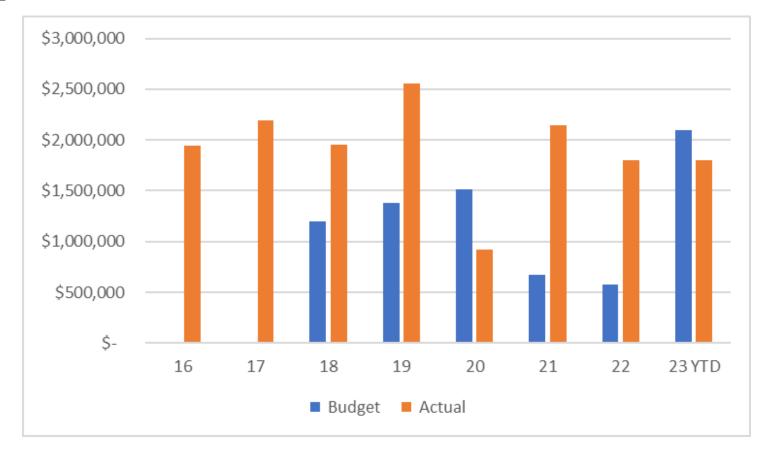
• Based on 2% increase over 2022 actual receipts (\$42.6 million)

### State Aid

- Overall increase of \$7.9M
  - DSS \$1.58M
  - Assigned Counsel \$1.49M
  - Whole Health \$1.71M
- Additional \$3M State Aid and \$8M Federal Aid expressed in budget– pass-through to TCAT



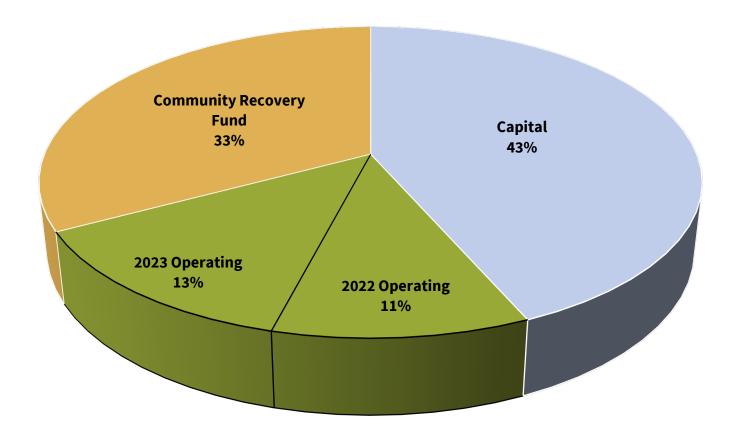
# Other Revenues / Savings / Fees

- Interest income estimated at \$800k in 2024
  - Increased from \$100k estimate in 2023 budget
- Continuing to estimate 2% position vacancy rate savings \$792k
- Recycling Materials Management: Solid Waste Fee Increase of \$5
  - From \$80 to \$85
  - Restructuring fees for colleges, universities and similar institutions



### Status of ARPA

- •\$19.8M Total
- •\$6.2M obligated toward capital projects
- •\$2.4M expended toward capital projects
- •\$6.5M obligated toward Community Recovery Fund projects
- •\$2.1M expended in one-time OTRs in 2022
- •\$2.6M obligated in one-time OTRs in 2023



Majority of ARPA funds have been obligated; \$120,319 in unspent OTR funds available for one-time projects in 2024 budget



# 2024 Over Target Requests (million)

- Legislature: Legistar Software; Training
- Planning: Membership Dues increases
- Sheriff: Body Worn Camera increases
- TCAT: 4% Underwriter Share increase
- Veterans: Memorials
- Youth: Rec. Partnership increase; COLAs
- Partial funding for ongoing eFMAP mandate



# Maintenance of Effort budget (5%)

Would include previous restorations within tax cap plus:

- County Admin- Media Productions Asst. + website fees
- County Historian + Historical Commission Publications
- HSC- OAR Core Services increase
- Office of Human Rights- Education & Outreach Coord. Restoration
- Planning & Sustainability- Housing Affordability
- Sheriff- 2 Deputies
- Veterans Services- Veterans Services Officer Restoration
- Full funding of ongoing eFMAP mandate



# Summary

- Recommended 2%
- Tax Cap= 3.54%
- MOE Budget = Estimated Tax Levy increase of 5%

Levy Increased/ Decreased by:	Impact on Levy	Impact on Homeowner
5% (MOE)	\$2,394,567	\$88
3.54% (Tax Cap)	\$1,855,764	\$73
2%	\$1,047,950	\$53

2023 median home value = \$249,000 Each 1% tax levy increase adds roughly \$524,000



### Risks in 2024

- Emergency shelter needs
- Airport
- Additional eFMAP increase in 2025: \$400k
- Positions supported with one-time funding
  - Decisions to be made in 2024 or 2025
