## How to test drugs with xylazine and fentanyl test strips.



Xylazine Test Strips can tell you if your drugs contain xylazine, a powerful non-opioid sedative.


Fentanyl Test Strips can tell you if your drugs contain fentanyl, a powerful opioid.

## Do not use test strips more than once.

- You can test your drugs for xylazine and fentanyl using the same sample.
- Finely crush pills and tablets, add water to the powder and mix thoroughly. If you do not want to test the entire pill, break it in half and test a portion from the middle.
- Put 10 (ten) milligrams ( mg ) of your drugs (enough to cover Abraham Lincoln's hair on a penny) in a clean, dry container.

- If you cannot test 10 mg of your drugs, put at least a few grains in a clean, dry container.
- Add water to your drugs and mix them up.
-For meth, MDMA and ecstasy, use 1 (one) teaspoon (about 5 ml ) of water for every 10 mg of crystal or powder you are testing.
-For all other drugs, use a half (1/2)
 teaspoon of water.
- Place the test strips with the wavy side down in the water. Let the strips absorb the water for 15 seconds.
- Take the strips out of the water and place it on a flat surface for 5 (five) minutes.



## Read the results: What do the test results mean?



Positive test: One line at the top means Xylazine, Fentanyl or a similar synthetic opioid has been detected in your drugs.


Negative Test: Two lines (even of one is very faint) means Xylazine, Fentanyl or a similar synthetic opioid has not been detected in your drugs.

Remember, no test is $100 \%$ accurate and your drugs may still contain xylazine, fentanyl or a similar synthetic opioid.


Invalid test: No lines or one line closer to the wavy side of the strip means the test is invalid. Retest your drugs using a new strip.
