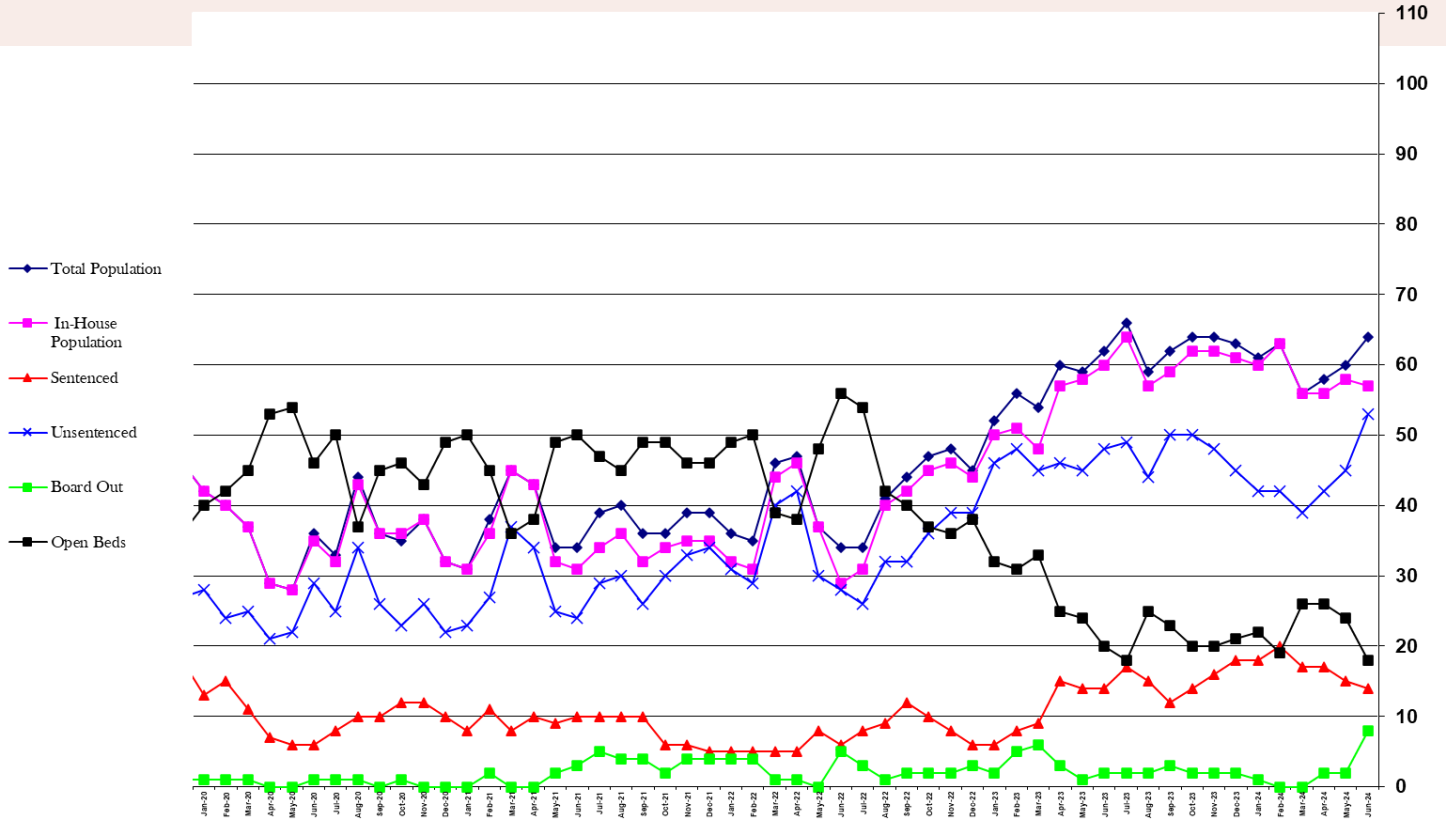

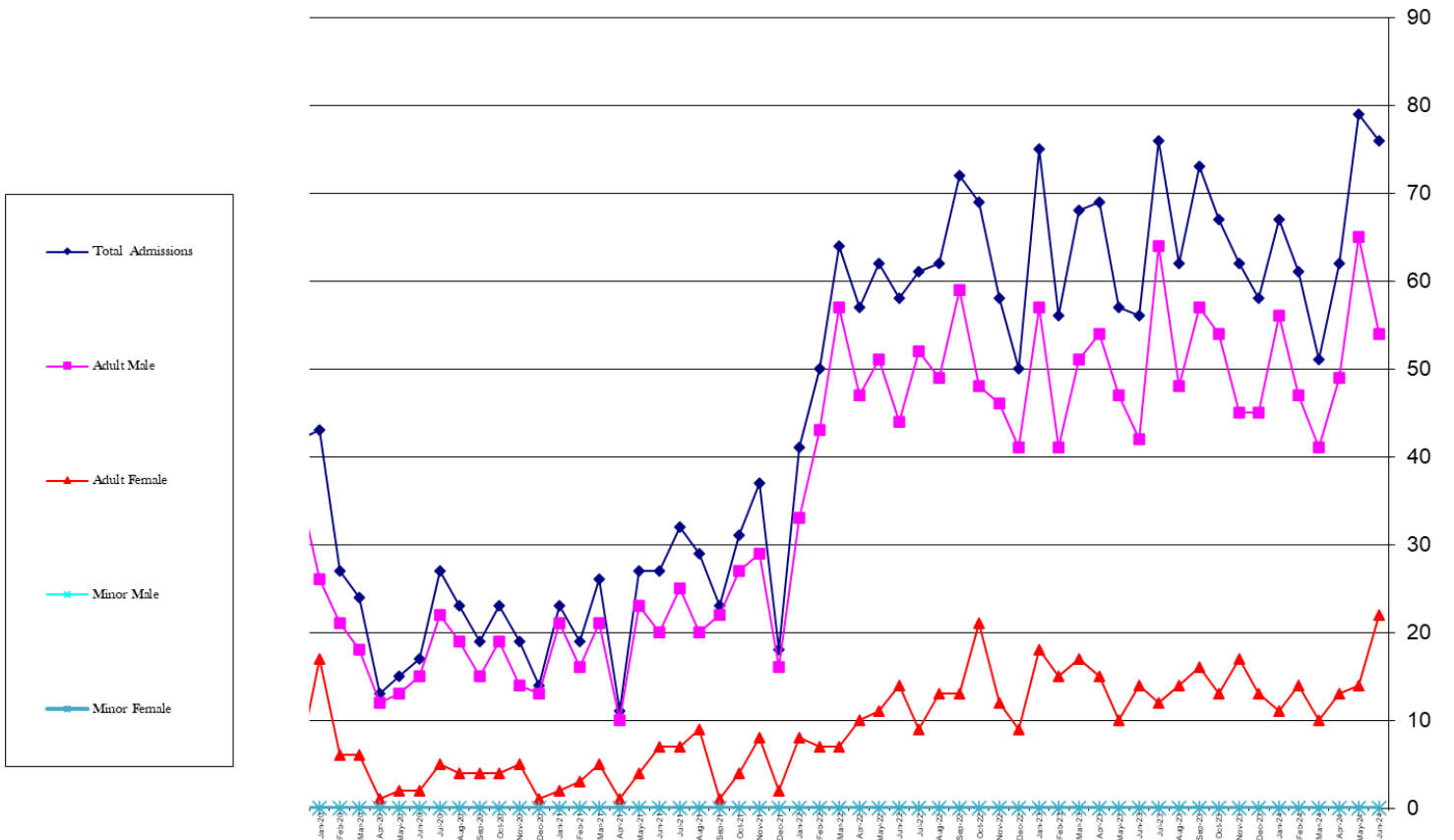

Average Jail Statistics

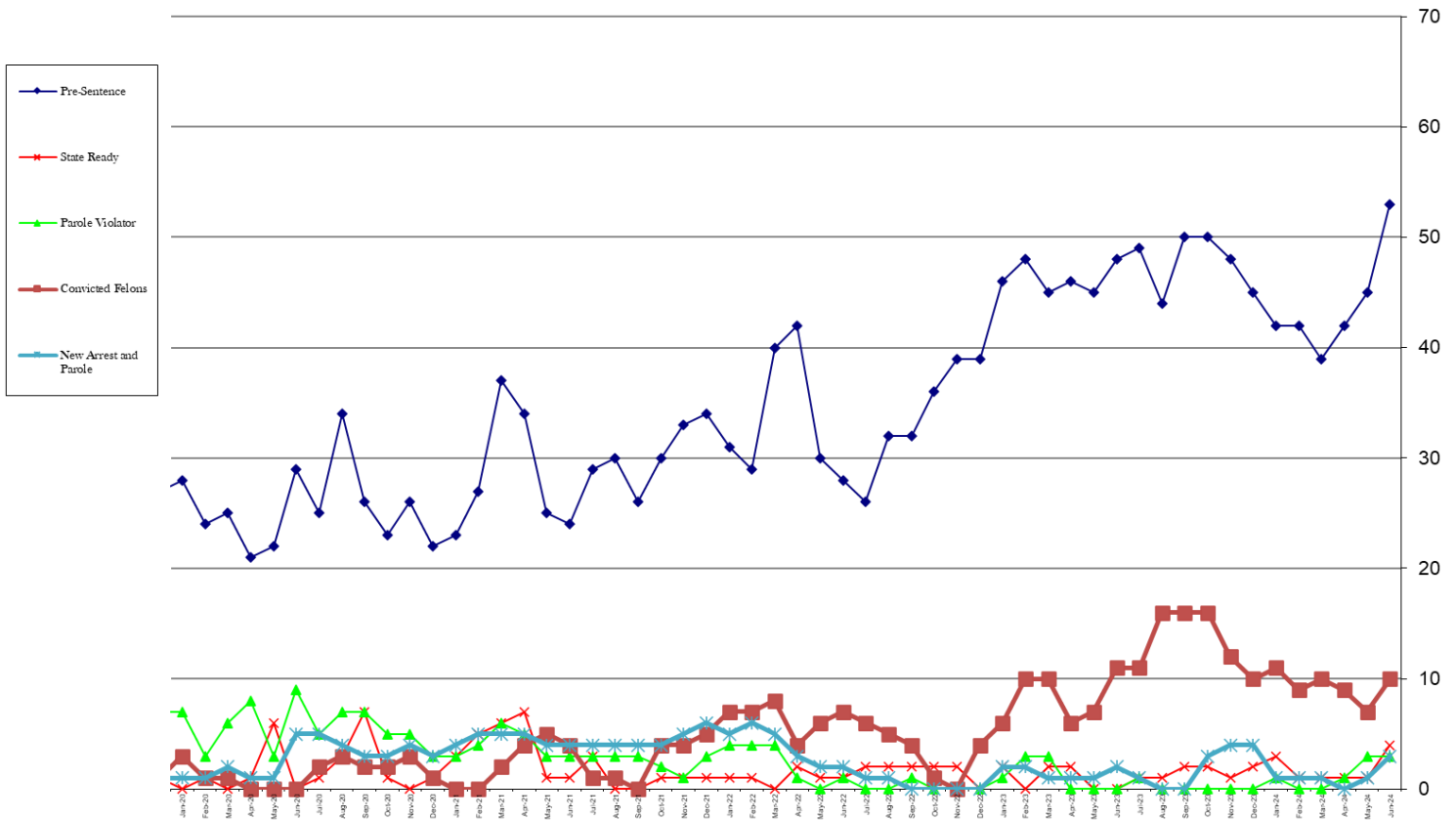


Monthly Admission Totals

ACTIVITIES

- **June 4, 2024:** The Sheriff's Office, in partnership with Tompkins County Information Technology Services, has finalized another dashboard within the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office Transparency Hub located on our website.

The latest dashboard provides detailed information pertaining to traffic stops & tickets handled by our office. As noted below in prior media releases, TCSO has completed and presented to the public several dashboards, to include those for our C.A.R.E. Team, Civilian Responders, and Defensive Action (Use of Force). This latest dashboard will update weekly.

We have also updated the Defensive Action dashboard to include 2024 data, which from this point forward will be updated on a monthly basis.



- **June 14, 2024:** Officer Elijah Griffin and Officer Dimetrius Miranda graduated from the New York State Basic Corrections Academy. The academy was hosted by the Broome County Sheriff's Office. In the academy, the officers studied several topics such as suicide prevention, ethics of law enforcement, CPR & AED, defensive tactics, firearms, effective communication, and more. We are proud of them and commend their commitment to serve this Office and the Tompkins County community.



ACTIVITIES CONTINUED

- **June 24, 2024:** Corrections Officer Kenneth Bellinger received the Officer of the Month award from Ithaca Kiwanis. He was recognized for his response to a medical emergency involving an incarcerated individual in the custody of our jail. Officer Bellinger immediately responded to the scene, placed the individual in a safe position on the floor and initiated a call for an ambulance. While waiting for the ambulance to respond, the individual took a turn for the worse and all signs of breathing and a pulse were lost. Officer Bellinger jumped into quick action and began performing CPR. He also utilized an AED device and administered Narcan on the side of caution.

Officer Bellinger, and others who were there to assist, continued in this effort until the ambulance arrived and transported the individual to an area hospital. Due to Officer Bellinger's quick actions, the individual was kept alive and afforded the opportunity to receive extended treatment at a hospital.

Officer Bellinger's actions and dedication to the well-being of people held in our local jail is exhibited by all our corrections officers every day, and he is more than worthy of receiving this recognition.

ACTIVITIES CONTINUED

- **June 30, 2024:** The Sheriff's Office created a Gun Involved Violence Elimination (GIVE) task force that has been operational for the past year. The goal was to focus on gun crime throughout the County, with a focus on the City of Ithaca. We are proud of the partnership that was formed with the District Attorney's Office, Tompkins County Probation, Ithaca Police Department, NYS Parole, the Southern Tier Crime Analysis Center, and others. The best results are achieved when we all work together!

Over the past year, the work of the task force has resulted in 12 violations, 111 misdemeanors, and 50 felony charges. We removed 20 illegally possessed firearms from the streets, 7 other miscellaneous weapons, 365 grams of methamphetamine, 27 grams of heroin, 285 grams of cocaine, and thousands of dollars in suspected drug money.

The work of the task force has been hugely successful and has resulted in the diminishment of shots-fired complaints, hampered illicit drug activity, and has made for a much safer community.

Starting July 1, 2024, the Ithaca Police Department will be taking the lead.
