

A contact tracer from your state health department might call you if you've been exposed to COVID-19. Scammers are pretending to be tracers too. Here are 5 things you should know to spot the scam.



Real contact tracers won't ask you for money.



Contact tracing does not require your bank account or credit card number.



Your immigration status doesn't matter for contact tracing, so real tracers will not ask.



Do not click on a link in a text or email. You might download malware onto your device.



Contact tracers won't ask for your Social Security number.
