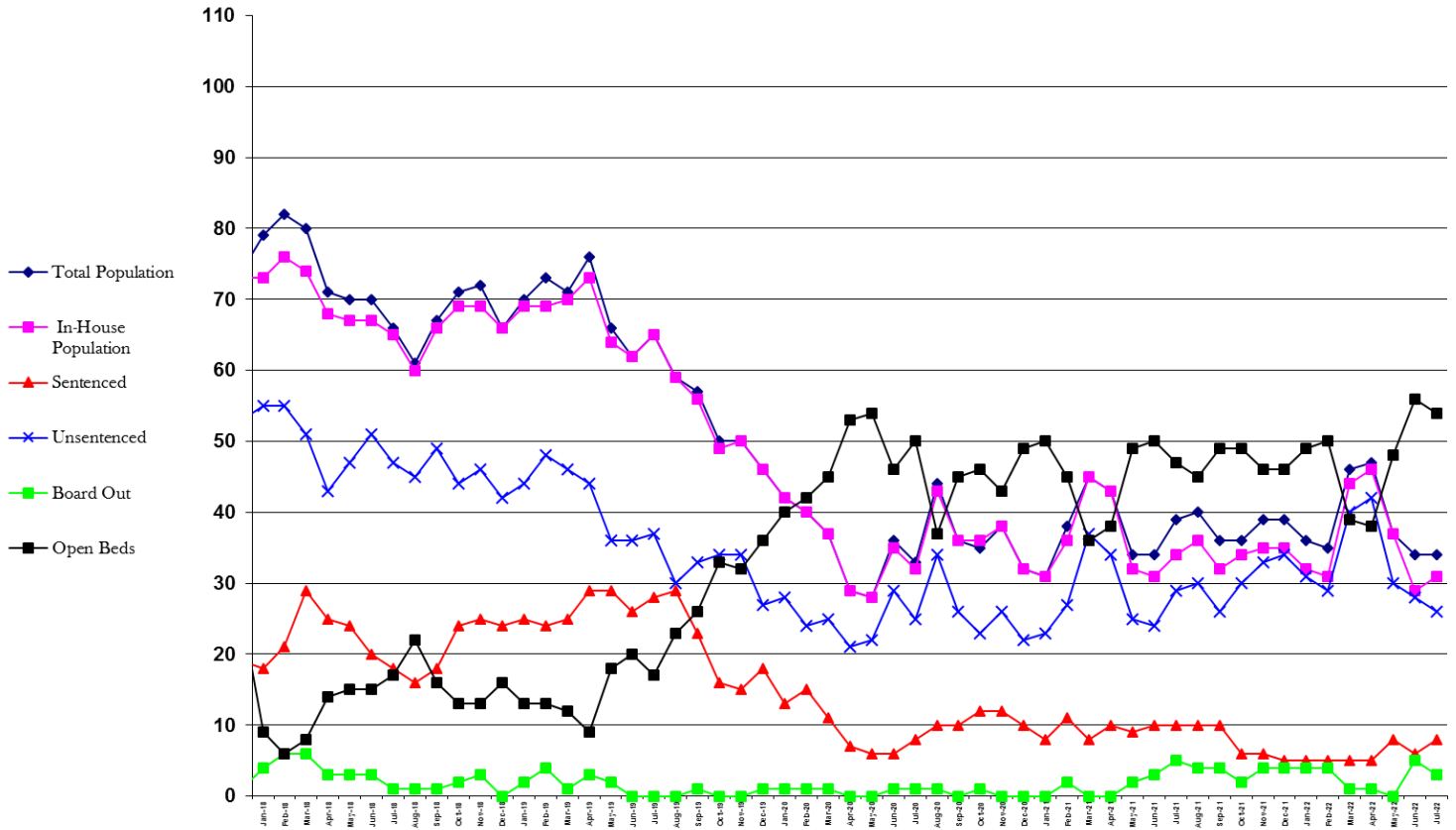

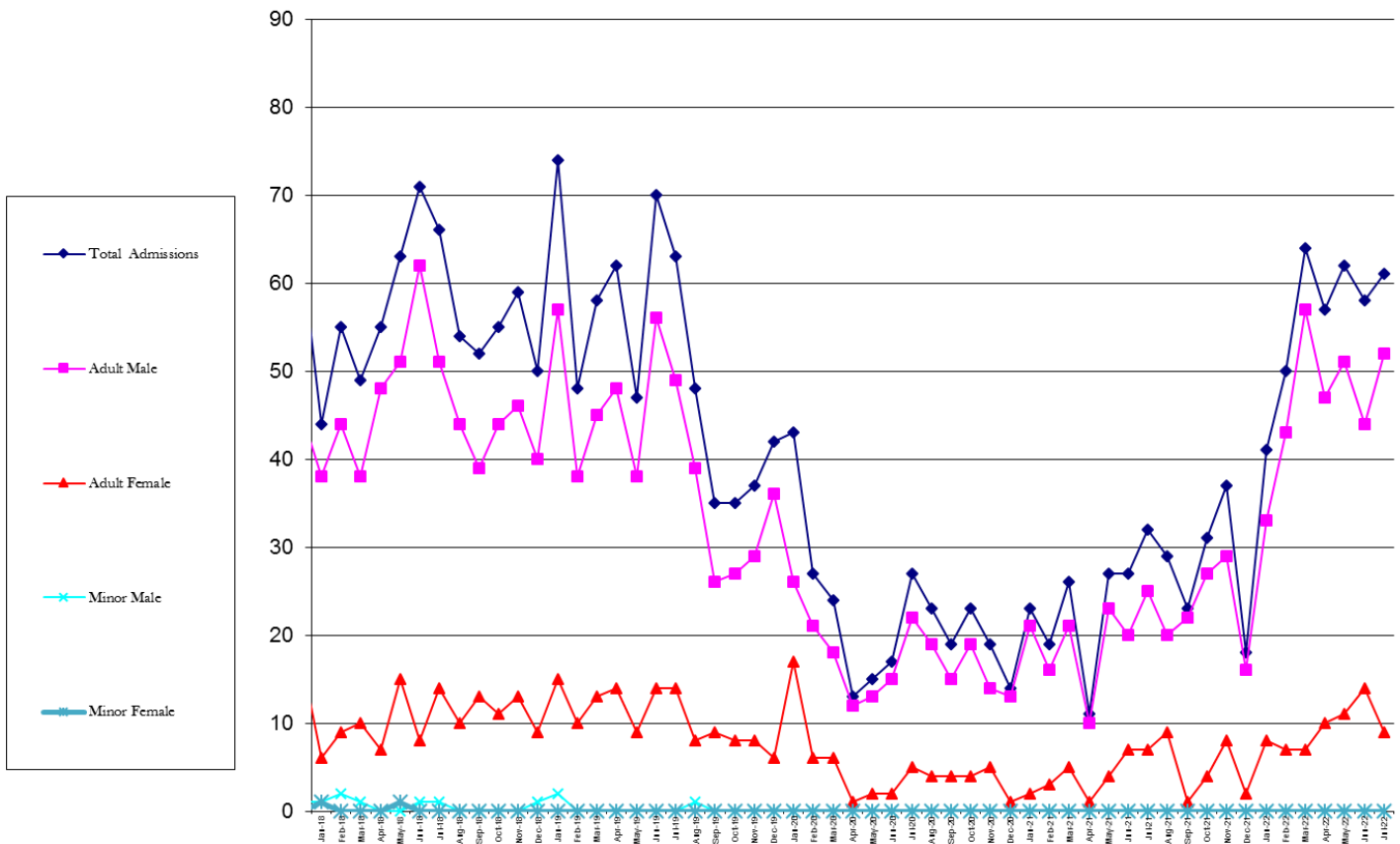

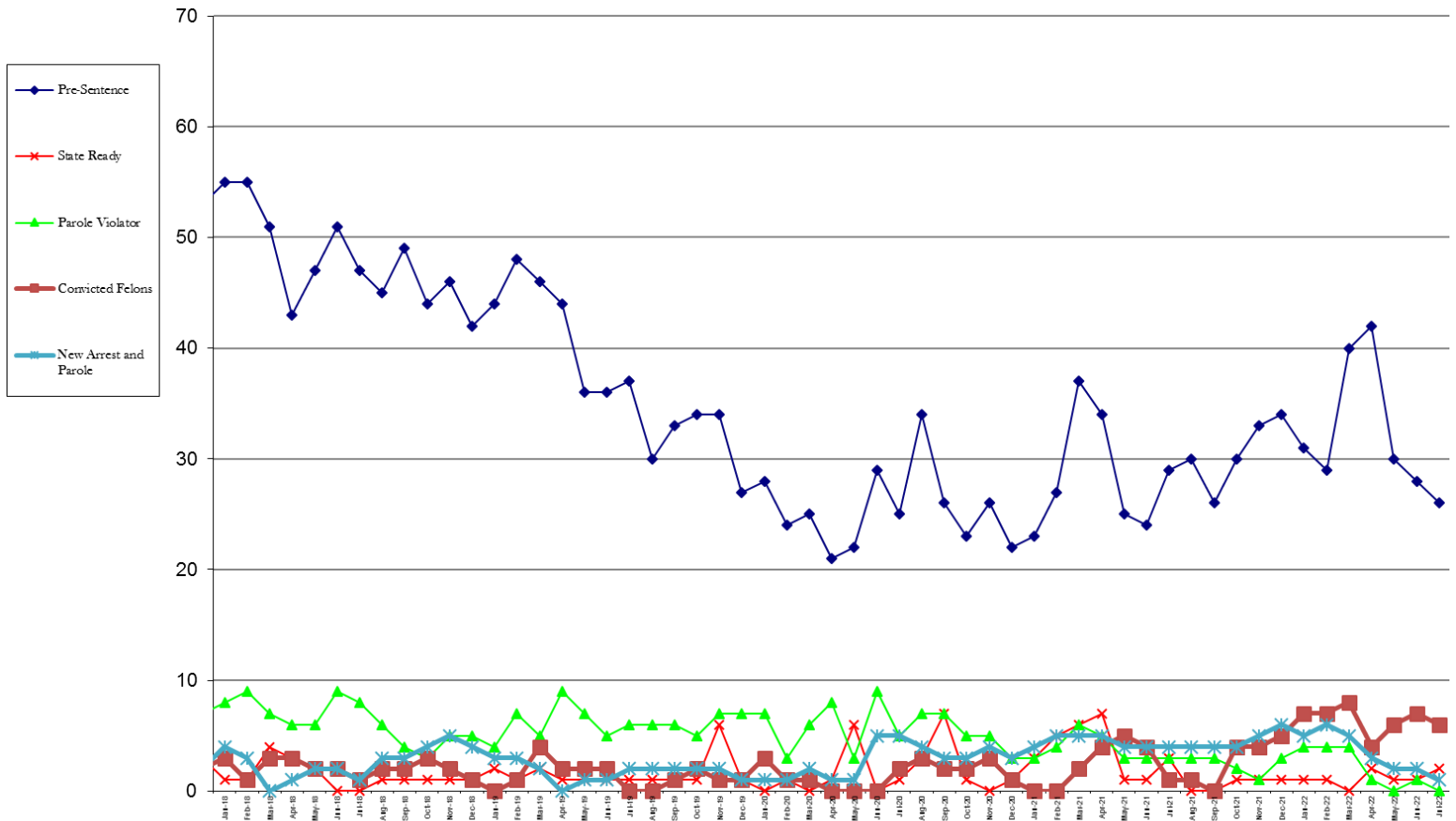

Hi,

I wanted to reach out and recognize your officer, M. Lansing, for the job she did on a call last Thursday that took place off of Burns Rd on the South Hill recreational trail.

The call was for a mental health patient and M. Lansing showed incredible compassion and genuine concern for this individual. The officer developed a good rapport with the patient and treated the patient respectfully throughout the interaction. This call could have gone very differently if M. Lansing was not involved. Your officer stayed calm and consistent with her words to the patient and eventually convinced the patient to willingly walk to the waiting ambulance for transport. The patient became uncomfortable once in the ambulance and the officer again stepped up and offered the patient the choice of riding in her patrol car to the hospital rather than the ambulance. The patient took her up on that offer and the officer transported the patient to the ER for evaluation.

The professionalism of your officers is no surprise to me but this interaction went above and beyond. I was thoroughly impressed with M. Lansing. She is an incredible asset to your department and I hope she knows how much we appreciated her being there.
