



Child Welfare programs successfully met Family First Prevention Service Act requirements: 53.3% of foster children are in kinship care (target is 30%), 10% of foster children are in congregate care settings (target is under 12%)

99.7% of Child Welfare Casework contact requirements were met (target is 95%)

Child Support collected \$5,732,405 (through November 2023) to provide care and support of children and families

80-88% of families assisted by a homelessness prevention or rapid re-housing program at Social Services have entered permanent housing in 2023.

Continued DEIA initiatives with 170+ staff at Social Services engaging in training, discussions and planning in the areas of: Disability at Work, Understanding and Undoing Implicit Bias, Gender Based Violence Awareness, LGBTQ+ Cultural Awareness and Supporting Race Equity in Child Welfare




20 Miles of County Road Resurfaced 34 Miles of County Road Preserved

Completed the Expanding Broadband Access Plan, mapping out areas where businesses and households lack access to fiber or coaxial broadband services

Achieved the highest distinction of Silver and a recordbreaking 360 points in the Climate Smart Communities recertification process

Restructure of Workforce Development Board and the Office of Employment and Training

Summer Youth Employment included 113 participants at 44 sites

Developed strategic partnerships with IAED Direct to Work, CCE's Green Career Pathways, Hospitality Employment Training Program Healthy Workforce Network, Ulysses Civic Engagement Work Program, and Groton Schools Career Center

Disability Resource Coordinator program provided employment supports to 135+ individuals with disabilities, 24% gaining unsubsidized employment within 3 months

- Over 165 customers enrolled in programs, 50% in youth programs

Civil Service Administration for 55 civil divisions, supporting more than 2,000 positions. Reviewed over 5262 employment applications. Conducted 118 Civil Service examinations

Training & Experience pilot program for Corrections Officers – 42 applicants and tested 23 and appointed 15 (11 permanent appointments and 4 provisional pending agility testing this month)

Hiring Emergency Limited Placement program (HELP program)for titles and appointments approved to date for Tompkins County:

- Licensed Clinical Therapists 5 appointments.
- Emergency Services Dispatcher Trainee 8 appointments
- Environmental Health Specialist 2 appointments
- Caseworker 2 appointments

Performed 461 (391 in 2022) recruitment efforts, 12 Executive level searches (11 in 2022), 8 In-person Job Fairs (6 in 2022),14 High School/College Presentations, 4 Mock Interview Sessions with Local Schools

County-wide training fund provided 90 employees with career development, leadership, and other training opportunities (60 in 2022)

Treasury Unit reached out to owners of 77 parcels that went into foreclosure, successfully redeeming 70 and processing the 7 that went to Public Auction

Accounts Payable and Payroll Unit issued over 30,000 payments

Worked with Administration to update & develop Procurement, Fiscal, Cash Management and Investment, Fund Balance, and Reserve policies

Accounting Unit coordinated implementation of the new governmental accounting standard for recording of leases (GASB 87)

Treasury Unit invested in Certificates of Deposits and worked with our banking partners to maximize current interest earnings

The County had a successful external audit for year ending 2022 with the issuance of an unqualified, or clean, audit opinion

Onboarded and trained over 100 new poll workers

Hosted three public demonstrations of new voting systems and contracted with Clear Ballot to provide new voting machines for elections beginning in 2024





Assessment

Completed 24th consecutive year of maintaining a uniform percentage of market value for all properties on the assessment roll. (The state stopped issuing the excellence in assessing awards...)

2023 Annual Equity Maintenance Program resulted in 26,131 changes in assessment (and only 5.6% of the changes came in to contest the change)

Total Assessed Value rose \$886 million to a total county valuation of just above \$16.1 billion (\$6 billion tax exempt)





Information Technology

Coordinated and hosted the inaugural Cyber Readiness Workshop for Tompkins County and local Municipal leaders

Deployed new layers of Cybersecurity policies and practices for all County employees, Administration and Legislators. Implemented initial phase of a NYS Cyber Information Sharing and Collaboration

Initiated a comprehensive upgrade and replacement project for critical infrastructure devices supporting all County departments and facilities, resulting in improved performance and reliability

Deployed over 200 end-user devices to further compliance with cyber best practices, utilizing new centralized procurement process

GIS completed redistricting and 2023 local election map and data update. Implemented data and mapping enhancements for County 911 CAD systems and Tompkins County Youth Camp guide. Internal updates including Assessment Tax Mapping, Simple Parcel Viewer, NRI Reporter, address and BOE Lookups. Participated in local Shared Service 911 addressing study

Advanced goals of a paperless office by increasing e-recording of land records and efiling of court records

Assisted customers with REAL ID or Enhanced licenses prior to federal deadline for domestic air travel requirements

DMV has consistently been rated between 95% and 100% approval rating by customers at our Happy or Not machine

Collected over 18.7 million in revenue for NYS, Tompkins County, and Towns – helping to offset property taxes

Handled over 60 family court cases, plus successfully responded to 2 appeals which were upheld in our favor

Processed 292 FOIL requests

Reorganized office to be more efficient within a smaller space

Effectively handled increased caseloads and demands of the office with half the staff of prior years
