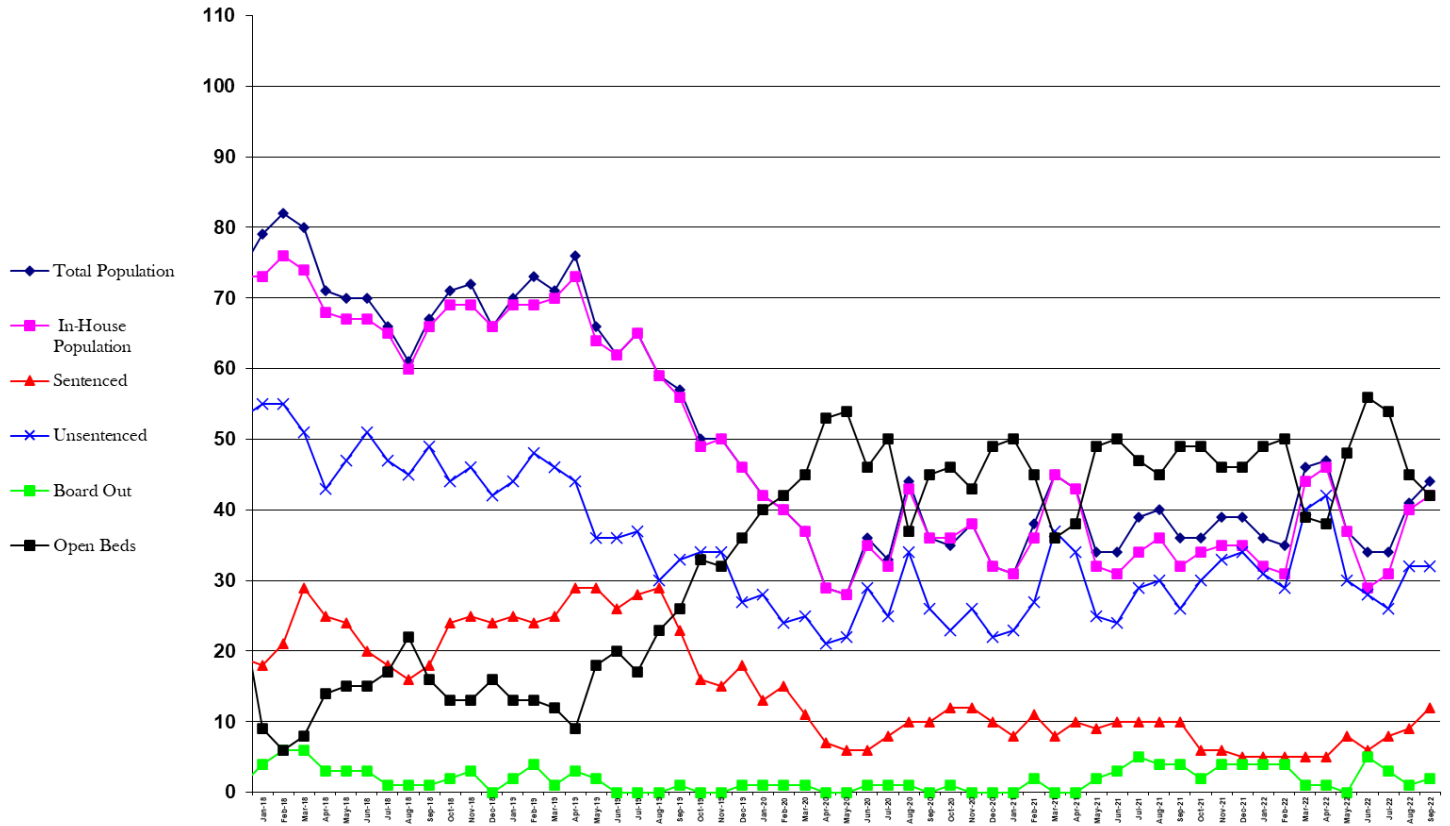

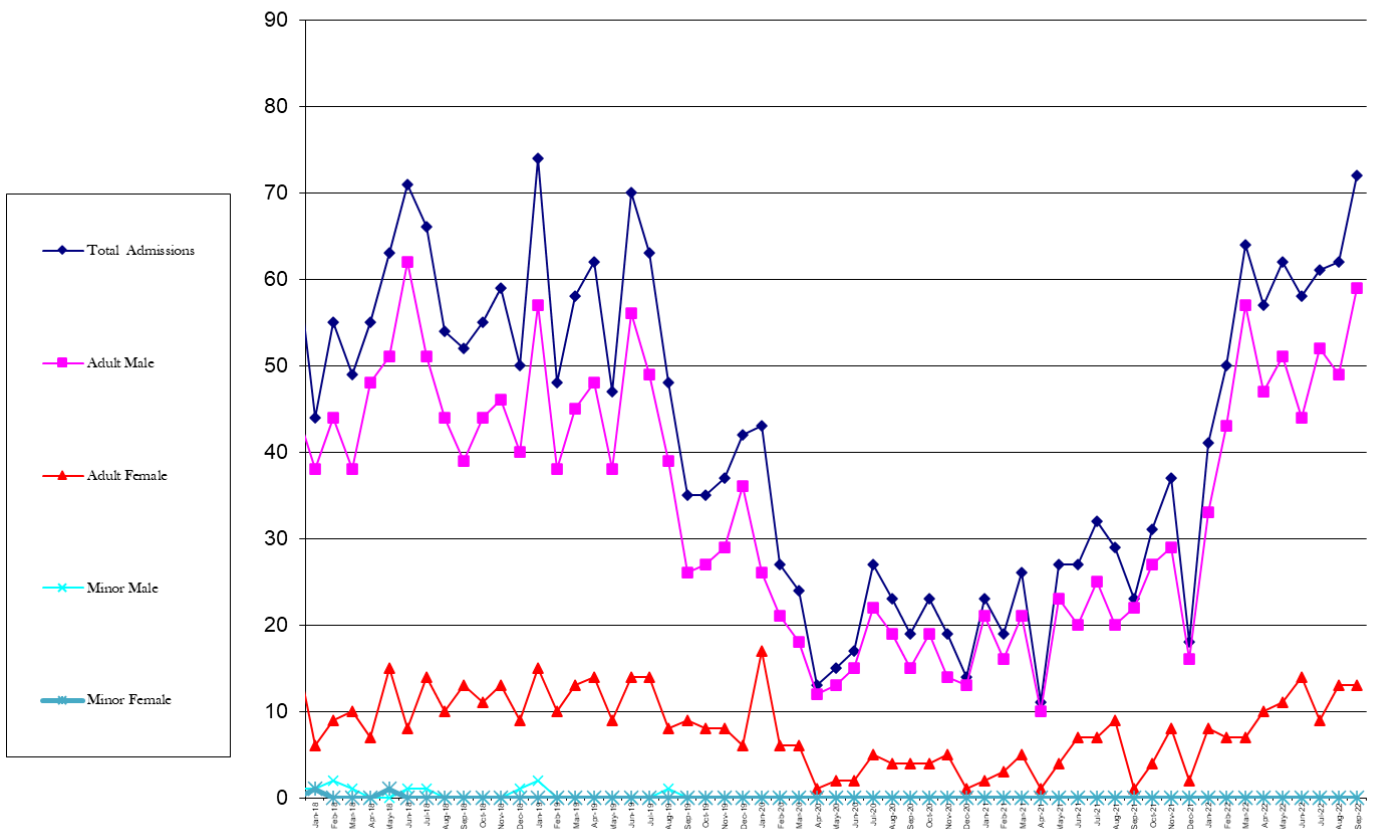

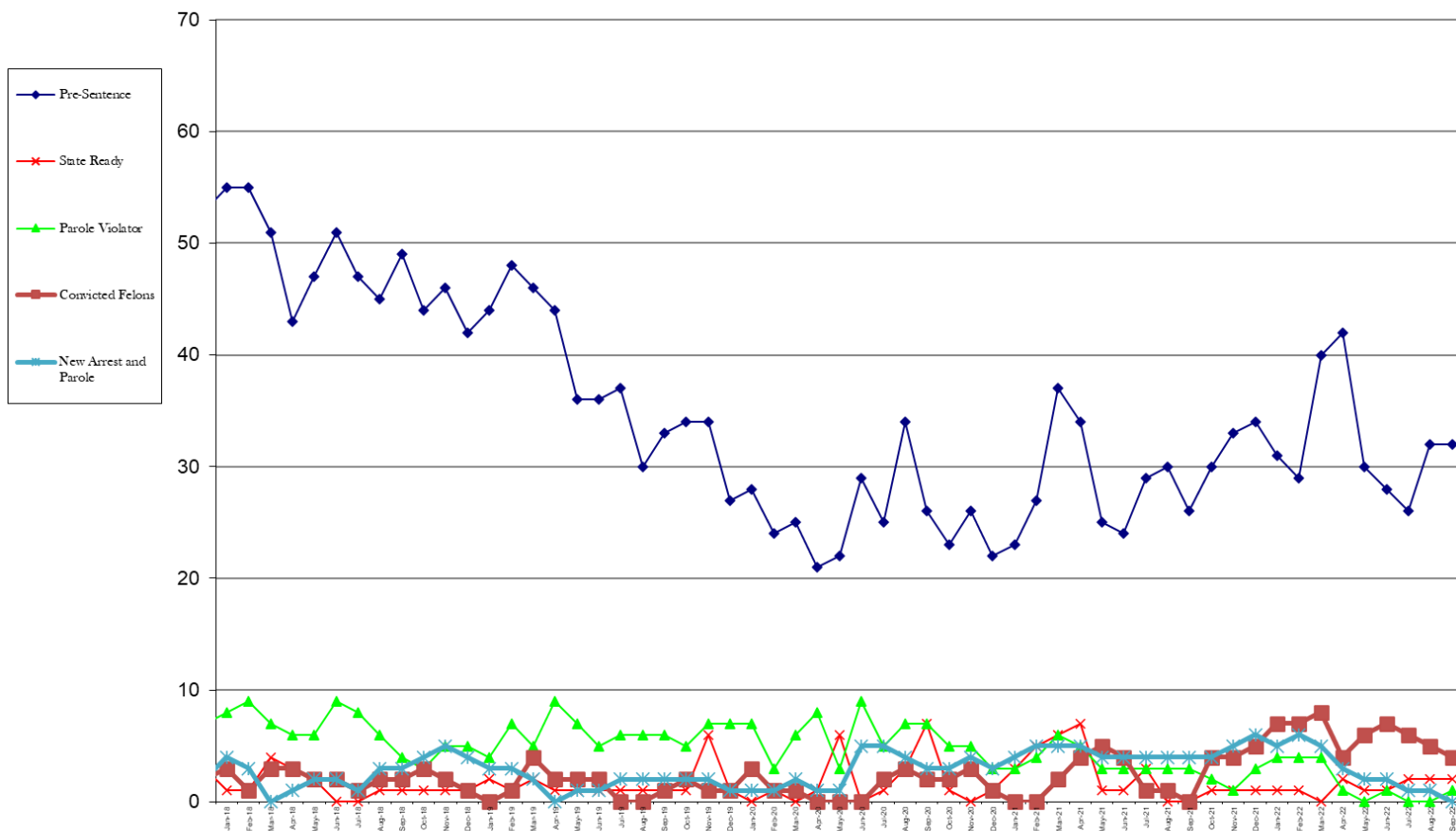

## ACTIVITIES

**September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022:** Corrections Officer Alpert received the Officer of the Month award from Ithaca Kiwanis. Officer Alpert received the award for his life-saving effort on the evening of April 22, 2022. An incarcerated person at the Tompkins County Jail had made the decision to attempt suicide. Officer Alpert walked into the housing unit just seconds after the incarcerated person put their plan into action. Officer Alpert immediately called for back up and began life saving efforts to prevent the suicide. Officer Alpert's actions on that evening were an example of diligence and professionalism. The ability to use his training and maintain a calm demeanor helped save this person's life. We are proud to have Officer Alpert as a member of the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office.



**September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2022:** Investigator Skeval presented to local real estate agents discussing everything from ways to keep yourself safe at a property, identifying suspicious circumstances, and ways to protect yourself.





**September 28<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup>, 2022:** Deputies Leach, Prior, and Miller attended the NABLEO Justice Reform: Changing the Paradigm of Community Policing. Featured workshops covered issues such as “Fair and Impartial Policing Through Understanding Implicit Bias; After the Bang-An Anatomy of A Fatal Use of Force; Weaponizing the Police-Profilng by Proxy; Prevention of Police Misconduct Through Ethical Decisions Making; Conflict Engagement for Law Enforcement; Civilian Oversight as a Police Accountability Mechanism; and other topics.



**September 23<sup>rd</sup>-25<sup>th</sup>, 2022:** TCSO Deputies provided traffic control assistance during the 2022 Lansing Community Celebration Carnival. Sheriff Osborne also announced the parade this year.



**August 19<sup>th</sup>-September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022:** The Tompkins County Sheriff's Office, New York State Police, municipal law enforcement agencies, and our local STOP-DWI Program collaborated across the county in an effort to reduce the number of impaired driving-related injuries and deaths throughout the End-of-Summer / Labor Day.
